

## REGIONAL WELL-BEING IN OECD COUNTRIES: ISRAEL

In 4 out of the 11 well-being dimensions, Israel has at least one region that ranks among the top 20% of the OECD regions, and in 5 dimensions there is at least one Israeli region among the bottom 20%. The Tel Aviv District is the top Israeli region in jobs, access to services, life satisfaction, income and environment. The largest regional disparities in Israel are found in the dimensions of jobs, community and access to services. All Israeli regions rank among the bottom 10% of the OECD regions in environment.

Note: Relative ranking of the regions with the best and worst outcomes in the 11 well-being dimensions, with respect to all 395 OECD regions. The eleven dimensions are ordered by decreasing regional disparities in the country. Each well-being dimension is measured by the indicators in the table below.

The high performing Israeli regions fare better than the OECD average in all of the well-being indicators except the number of rooms per person, the disposable income per capita and air pollution. In the low performing regions, the household disposable per capita income is around one-third the OECD average.
