

BIO FOR SUE RUTLEDGE

Sue Rutledge is the World Bank's regional expert on consumer protection and financial literacy as well as corporate and financial governance. She initiated the program in financial consumer protection in 2006 with diagnostic reviews for the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Romania, Croatia and Azerbaijan. She also leads the Bank's regional program on corporate and financial governance, which over ten years has prepared reports on 26 of the 29 economies in the Europe and Central Asia Region. In her 18 years at the World Bank, Ms. Rutledge has also advised governments on privatization of telecommunications companies and other state enterprises and managed the post-conflict reconstruction program for Croatia. The latter included the first World Bank loan to finance the clearing of antipersonnel landmines.

Prior to joining the World Bank, Ms. Rutledge was a Vice President in Corporate and Investment Banking at Security Pacific Bank (now Bank of America). She began her career in the executive training program of Citibank Canada. She holds degrees in economics and Chinese history from McGill University and the University of Western Ontario in Canada. She also studied Chinese language and history at the Sorbonne in Paris and economics at the University of Toulouse in France.
