

Kenneth Coates

Mr. Coates has been Director General of the Centre for Latin American Monetary Studies since January 2001. CEMLA is the regional association of central banks of Latin America and the Caribbean, dedicated to research, capacity-building and technical assistance.

During the nineties he worked for the most part in the private financial sector in Uruguay as a member of the Montevideo Securities Exchange and consultant to various international and local organizations.

He was previously Executive Director on the Board of the World Bank (1985-86) representing the Southern Cone countries, and subsequently became Uruguay's Financial Representative in Washington (1987-90) where he coordinated the work-out from the 80's debt crisis. Before that he had worked as an economist at the International Monetary Fund (1977-79), the World Bank (1979-81) and as senior advisor at the Ministry of Economics and Finance in Uruguay (1981-84).

Mr. Coates holds an M.A. & Ph.D. in Economics from Stanford University (1973-77) and has held the Chair in Development Economics at the University of the Republic of Uruguay (1982-84) and in International Economics and Finance at ORT University, Uruguay (1991-2000). He has authored numerous papers and articles in specialized journalism.
