

Prof. Hazel BATEMAN

Hazel Bateman is an Associate Professor in the School of Actuarial Studies and Director of the Centre for Pensions and Superannuation (CPS) at the University of New South Wales. She has teaching and research interests in the economics and finance of retirement and retirement saving. The overall themes of her research include the adequacy and security of retirement saving and retirement benefits, and the increasing risk and responsibility faced by retirement savers under defined contributions retirement income arrangements. Her current research focuses on the complexity of retirement saving decision making, funded by a 5 year ARC Discovery Grant – ‘The paradox of choice: unravelling complex superannuation decisions’. Hazel has consulted on retirement income issues to a number of national and international organizations, most recently the China-Australia Governance Program on a project involving the design and implementation of pensions for China’s migrant workers. Before joining UNSW, Hazel worked for nearly 10 years with the Australian Treasury where she was involved in forecasting and taxation policy.
