Social Expenditure

Purpose

To publish the CD-ROM "OECD Social Expenditure Database (SOCX)". The database has been developed to monitor trends in aggregate social expenditure as well as changes in its composition. SOCX includes historical series from 1980 on public and mandatory private social expenditure at programme level classified under the major social policy areas.

Objectives and outputs

Social Expenditure Database: annual collection (in co-operation with Eurostat for EU countries) and dissemination on CD-ROM of expenditure data, programme by programme, grouped in the main expenditure categories.

Main tasks achieved:

- comparison of the SOCX (OECD) and ESSPROS (Eurostat) methodologies for classifying data on social expenditures, in collaboration with Eurostat.
- improved consistency with the OECD Active labour market programmes and Health data bases.
- update and extension of the coverage to 30 OECD countries.

Main Developments for 2003

General aspects:

Main changes include: updating the dataset to include 2000 data; apply new structure of broad policy areas to database; improving the consistency of the data with the OECD Labour Market Policy and Health database; and improve transparency of data classification along the SOCX (OECD) and ESSPROS (Eurostat) methodologies (in collaboration with Eurostat).
