Christina Sampogna is Senior Project Leader for Patents and Biotechnology, within the Patent Policy Directorate, Department of Industry. In this capacity, she is responsible for the unit that develops the Government of Canada's patent policy for the field of biotechnology and undertakes legislative reform.

After completing a degree in Civil Law (LL.L.) and a degree in Common Law (LL.B.), Christina obtained her Master of Laws (LL.M.) from the University of Cambridge. She also obtained a D.E.A. in European Community Law from the College of Europe. In the course of these studies, she specialised in intellectual property and biotechnology. In addition to law firm experience, she has provided legal and policy advice to government and expert committees and has been involved in legislative reform. Christina was a law clerk at the Supreme Court of Canada and has been Canadian negotiator for various international agreements.

Christina's areas of interest include: the intellectual property protection of emerging technologies, particularly biotechnology; the social and ethical implications of biotechnology; the role of intellectual property in the commercialisation of innovations; human rights; and international trade law and particularly its IP dimensions (*i.e.*, TRIPS, NAFTA, FTAA).
