

Stéphane Jacobzone is a senior economist with the Regulatory Management and Reform Division of the OECD. He is in charge of reviews of regulatory reform in OECD countries, and has been recently involved in projects for Norway, France, Mexico and Switzerland. He has administered the Regulatory Governance Initiative to strengthen regulatory institutions and foster private sector investment in South Eastern Europe since the beginning of 2003. He is also conducting thematic research on regulatory authorities, both in OECD countries, and beyond, with a report on regulatory authorities in South East Europe published in 2003 under the auspices of the OECD Investment Compact.

Mr. Jacobzone graduated from the Ecole Polytechnique (France) in 1987 and from the French National School for Economics and Statistics (ENSAE) 1989. Prior to joining the OECD in 1997, he worked as a senior civil servant with the French Ministry of Finance and the Treasury. His work included assessing the efficiency of the public sector and liberalising French public utilities. He was also involved in various public finance projects and the regulation of pharmaceuticals. Since joining the OECD, he has served in the Directorate for Employment Labour and Social Affairs and the Directorate for Public Governance and Territorial Development. He has worked on the economic implications of ageing populations for public finances. He was also involved in regulatory issues in the health care and pharmaceutical sectors. He is also involved in the co-ordination of a number of multi-directorate activities at the OECD, including the regulatory reform programme.
