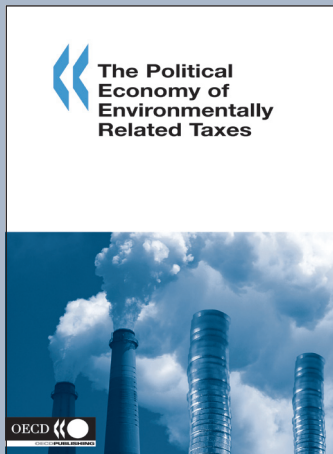

The Political Economy of Environmentally Related Taxes

Environmentally related taxes are increasingly used in OECD countries, and ample and increasing evidence of their environmental effectiveness is now available. However, there remains a high potential for a wider use of these environmental policy instruments, provided that they are well designed and that their potential impact on international competitiveness and income distribution are properly addressed. In particular, the environmental effectiveness and economic efficiency of environmentally related taxes could be improved further if existing exemptions and other special provisions included in the taxes were scaled back, and if the tax rates were better aligned with the magnitude of the negative environmental impacts to be addressed.

Based on experience in OECD countries, this book provides a comprehensive discussion of these issues and of recent research on the environmental and economic impacts of applying environmentally related taxes – in particular, it looks at how to overcome obstacles to their implementation. It also discusses the environmental and economic effects of combining such taxes with other instruments for environmental policy.

- > **THE TAX ON PLASTIC BAGS** applied in Ireland since 2002 has contributed to the reduction in their use by more than 90%.
- > **REVENUE** from environmentally related taxes equals around 2% of GDP in OECD countries
- > **ECOLOGICAL TAX REFORM** in Germany has led to a 2-3% reduction in energy consumption and carbon dioxide emissions since 1999.
- > **THE PESTICIDES TAX**, introduced in Denmark in 1996, contributed to a 10-13% reduction in pesticides use from 1995 to 1996.
