

Finalisation of report

-

Financing strategies session at 5WWF (2)

- Composition of panel (6 or 7):
 - Water Directorate of an OECD middle-income country (e.g. Mexico)
 - Water Directorate of a developing country (e.g. Senegal)
 - Ministry of Finance of a developing country (e.g. Vietnam)
 - IADB
 - Private sector (e.g. AquaFed)
 - NGO (e.g. BPDWS)
 - IWRM community (e.g. GWP)
- Issues for discussion:
 - Why is SFP useful?
 - What are the lessons learned from SFP?
 - What are the success factors of SFP?
 - Should such approaches be broadened beyond WSS, ie the WRM agenda?

High-level EPOC-DAC meeting

- 28-29th of May 2009
- Agenda needs to be agreed by DAC and EPOC in coming months
- Anticipated that at least one agenda item would focus on progress in implementing the « Framework for common action » that this work is part of
- SFP report will be one of the background documents
