



George F. Redling is the co-chair of the regulatory reform sub-group, established under the GfD Working Group IV.

From Canada, Mr. Redling is the Assistant Secretary to Cabinet, Regulatory Affairs and Orders in Council for the Privy Council Office of Canada, a role he has fulfilled since 1998. In this capacity he is responsible for supporting the President of the Treasury

Board in his role as federal champion of the Smart Regulation initiative. He has been at the centre of Canada's ongoing regulatory reform efforts and the development of Canada's federal regulatory policy, the federal regulatory oversight function and the development of tools and institutions to support the policy.

Prior to his role as at the Privy Council Office, Mr. Redling held a series of senior management positions within the federal government at the Departments of Industry Canada and Consumer and Corporate Affairs Canada.

Mr. Redling currently serves as the Chair of the Bureau of the OECD Working Party on Regulatory Management and Reform and has chaired meetings of the Special Group on Regulatory Policy, the OECD's forum for horizontal policy dialogue.

Previous to joining the Government of Canada, Mr. Redling established a private practice in commercial and corporate law in Calgary, Alberta.
