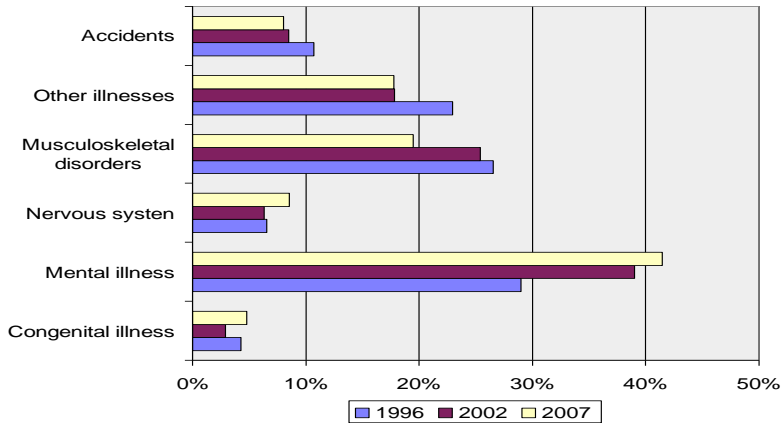
2008: Debt of CHF **13**bn

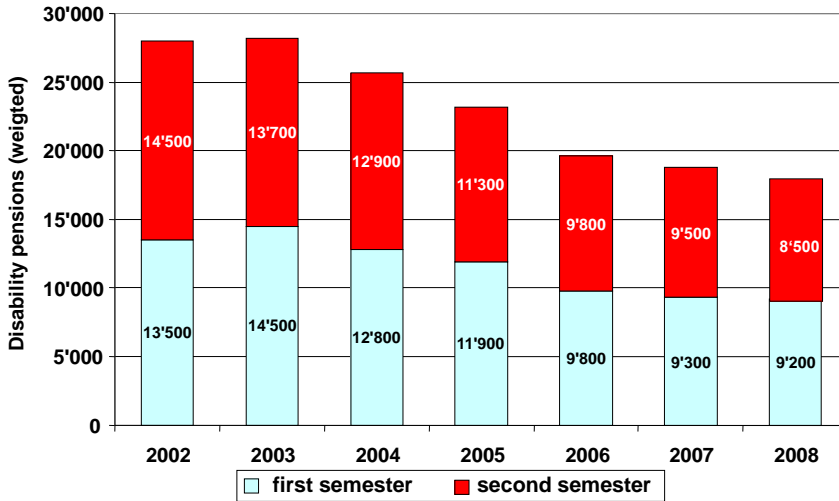
4th and 5th revisions of the disability insurance law – key innovations

- Implementation of insurance-run medical services
- Introduction of early detection and early intervention system
- Introduction of measures aiming at integration of persons with mental health problems
- Stricter pension eligibility criteria
- Advice, support and incentives for the insured and employers alike
- Cutbacks

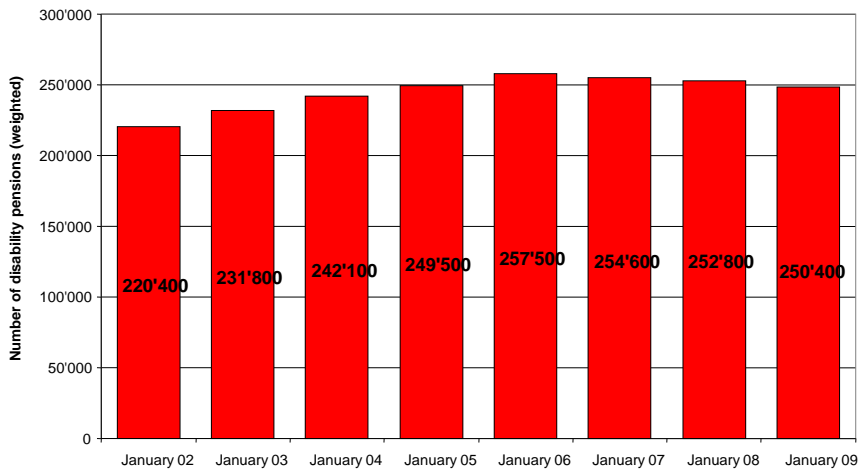
