



Elizabeth Ruddick is Director General of the Research and Evaluation Branch at Citizenship and Immigration Canada. Since joining the department in 1992, she has been responsible for a range of research and policy activities, development of new longitudinal databases to support research and evaluation of outcomes, policies for the skilled worker and economic immigration programs, evaluation and audit. In her current position she lead's CIC's immigration and citizenship research program and heads the department's evaluation function. Elizabeth is the Chair of OECD's Working Party on Migration and has represented Canada to the OECD, on migration matters, for over 10 years. Prior to working in the immigration field, she held a senior position in macroeconomic forecasting and in energy economics, working in the public and private sectors in Canada.
