

MARC RECORDS – AUGUST 2011 UPDATE

BACKGROUND

OECD iLibrary is offering MARC records to subscribers. Based on user input MARC records are provided in MARC21 XML format according to U.S. Library of Congress* specifications.

With the August 2011 update improved MARC records for all content – Books, Papers and Statistics - are provided.

Because of the improvements to the structure and meta data of the records, all files have been revised and the monthly files now start in August 2011. See Annex 1 for more information about the corrections and additions introduced.

MARC records are offered for downloading in two set of files:

1. One comprehensive file containing MARC records for all content currently on OECD iLibrary:
All records – including latest update (accumulative) and similar files separately for **Books, Papers, and Statistics**.
The files are updated on the first day of each month.
2. One Incremental file containing MARC records for all content added in the last month:
All records - Latest Update only (incremental) and similar files separately for **Books, Papers, and Statistics**.
A new file is added on the first day of each month.

MARC records are not generated for every content item type published on OECD iLibrary. For instance, no records are needed for book chapters, tables, graphs, or for each journal issue, each annual book edition, each OECD Economic Outlook edition, each OECD Economic Surveys edition, each statistical periodical issue, or each chapter of a statistical periodical issue.

FORMAT OF MARC RECORDS

MARC records are provided in MARCXML format. A freely available software package, *MarcEdit* (available to download from <http://people.oregonstate.edu/~reaset/marcedit/html/downloads.html>) allows the conversion to standard MARC format.

The records are generated in English only, and describe the online version of a content item. However, MARC records are generated for content item in other language versions than English, but the record itself will be produced in English.

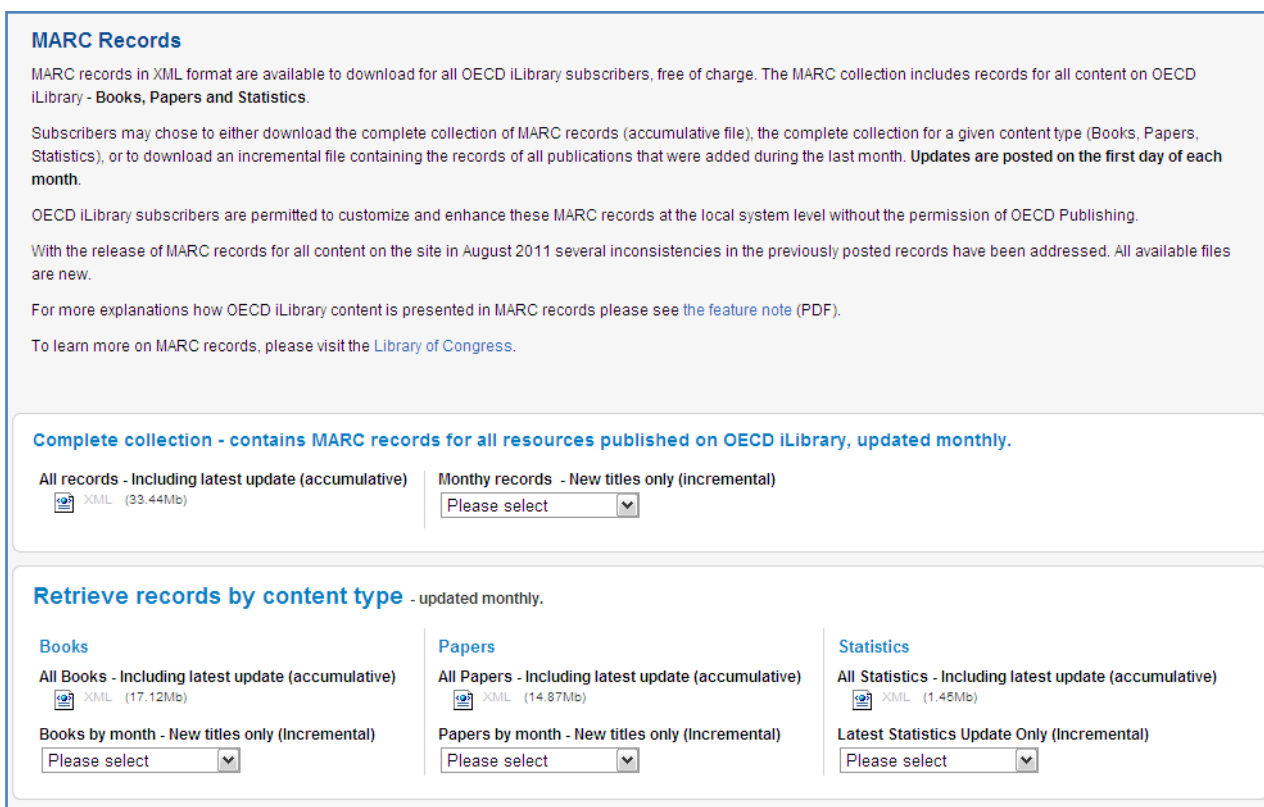

To download one of the accumulative files of MARC records of a collection/content type:

1. Move the cursor on top of the XML icon and use the secondary (right) menu command "Save link as ..." or "Save Target as ..." to
2. Download the XML file and save/rename it to your local computer system.

To download one of the incremental files of MARC records of a collection/content type:

1. Click the drop-down menu of the desired collection and select the month for which you would like to download the MARC records.
2. The download will automatically start. Save/rename the file to your local computer system, if necessary.

Note: Depending on which browser is used, clicking the XML icon may load the XML file in the browser window.
