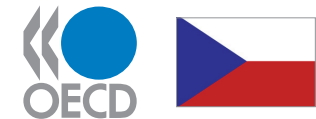
Employment Opportunities at OECD

The Czech Republic has been a member of the OECD since 21 December 1995.

As a member of the OECD, the Czech Republic is part of a unique forum which provides its 30 member countries with tools to analyse and monitor their economic, social and environmental policies. But above all OECD is a forum within which countries can discuss and share national experience, identify best practices and find solutions to common problems. OECD is at the forefront of efforts to understand and to respond to global challenges. It has working relationships with an increasing number of non-member countries, international organisations and business representatives.

OECD Work on the Czech Republic

There are two regular publications covering economic developments and policy in the Czech Republic:

- OECD Economic Survey of the Czech Republic, published every 18 months, identifies the main economic challenges faced by the country and analyses policy options to meet them. The most recent edition can be found at: www.oecd.org/eco/surveys/czech.
- The OECD Economic Outlook, published twice a year, analyses the major trends and forces that shape the short-term economic prospects in each member country and provides a short assessment of economic conditions and presents the latest projections.

OECD also publishes other reviews of the Czech Republic on topics such as development, energy the environment. Many other publications have chapters dedicated to the Czech Republic. When this is the case, they are also featured on www.oecd.org/czech.

OECD Statistics on the Czech Republic

In the Czech statistical profile available at www.oecd.org/czech/statistics, visitors will find more than 100 indicators covering a wide range of areas (e.g. economy, education, energy, health, trade and investment, taxation). Links to more up-to-date data and longer time series are also provided. In one simple click, the data about the Czech Republic can be easily compared with other OECD countries.

OECD also publishes a series of statistical compendiums that compare the Czech Republic with other member countries on topics such as health, environment, society, development aid, science, technology and industry. These web books are publically available at www.oecd.org/publications/ata glance.

- **Government Officials:** OLIS is OECD's password-protected website for member country government officials and other authorised organisations. It provides access to official Committee documents, phonebook, meeting information, and all OECD publications and statistical products. A free account to OLIS can be requested here: www.oecd.org/olisnet.
- **Journalists:** the media has access to all publications and all our statistical databases via a password-protected site: www.oecd.org/media.
- **Researchers and students:** Institutions subscribing to SourceOECD have access to our online library of e-books, e-periodicals and interactive statistical databases: www.sourceoecd.org. Three Czech universities are currently subscribed. Their details can be found on www.oecd.org/czech.
