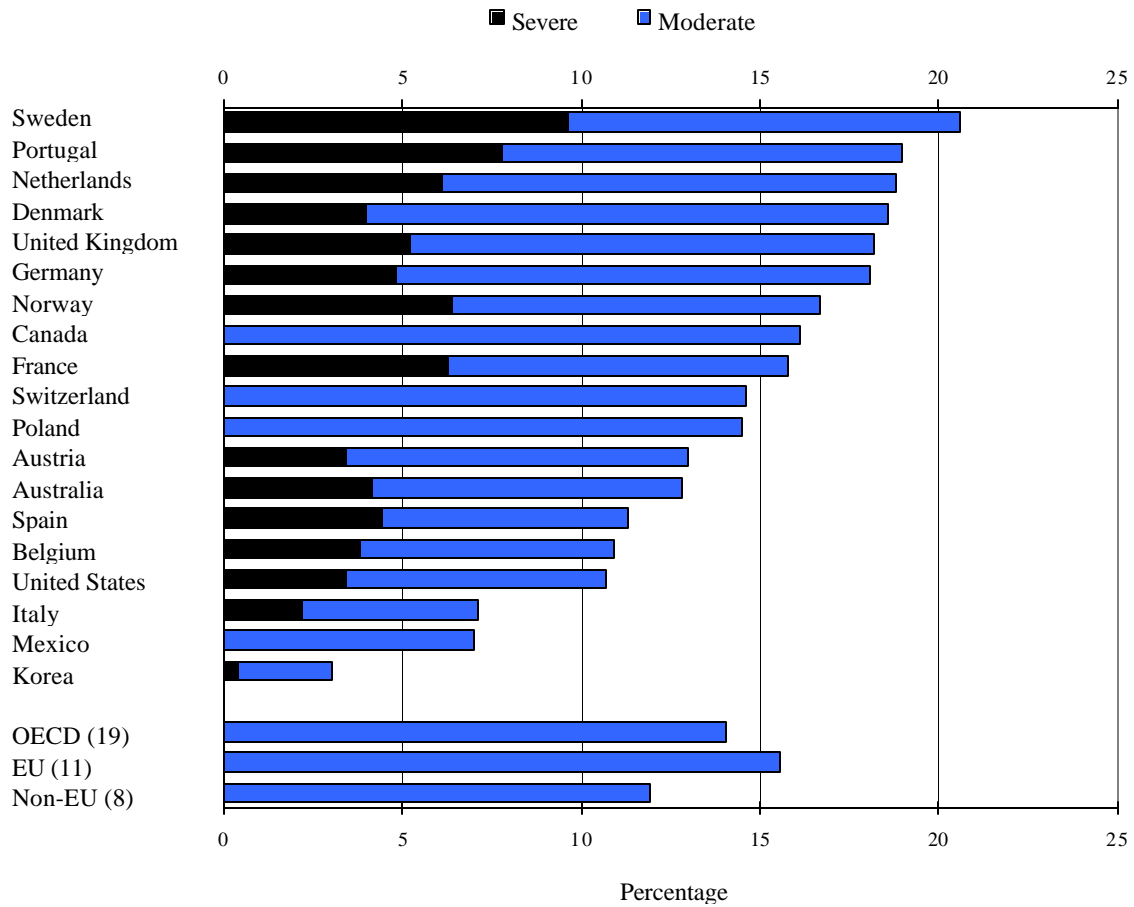


Chart 3.1 Average disability prevalence of 14 percent, of which one-third are severely disabled

Disability prevalence, by severity of disability, as a percentage of 20-64 population, late 1990s

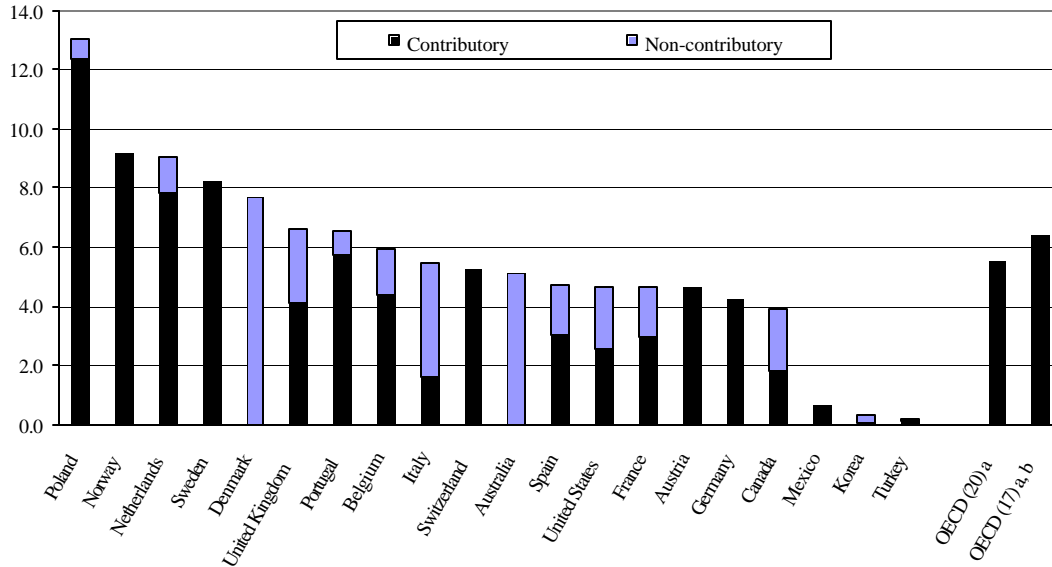

a) Contributory and non-contributory benefits.

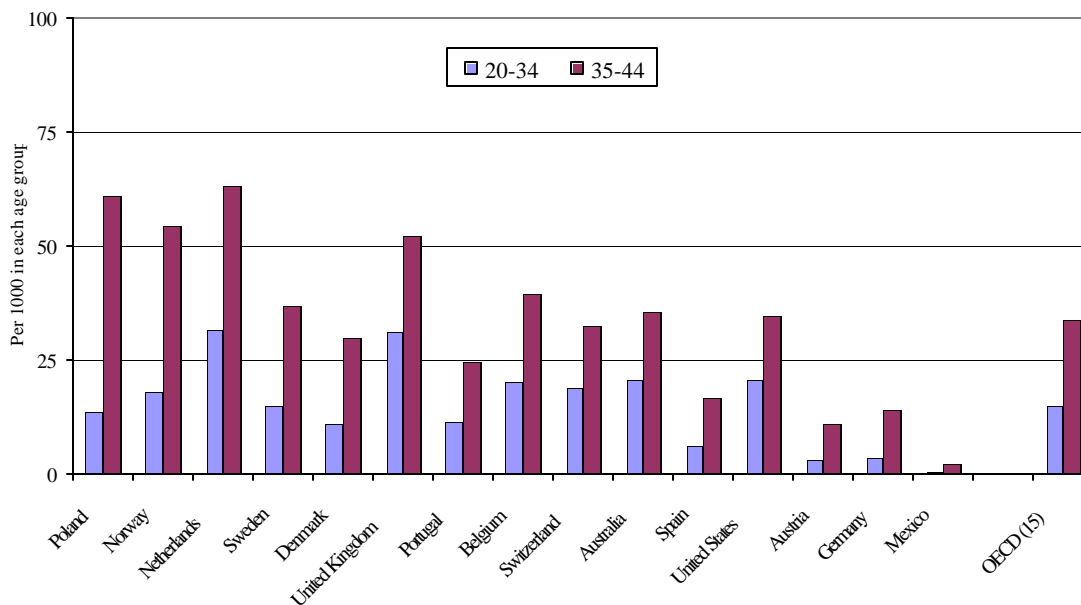

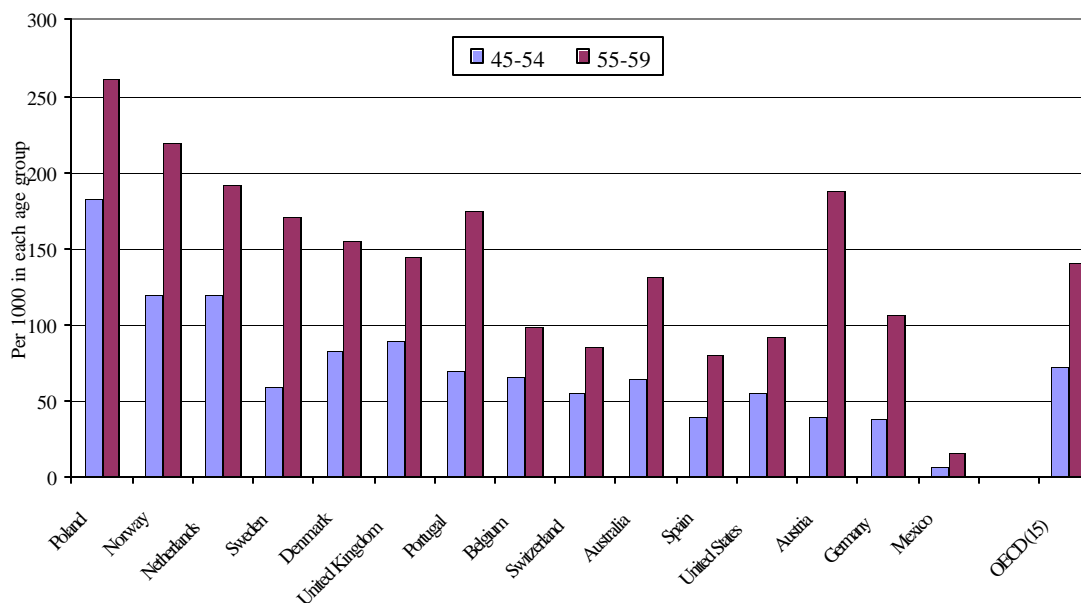
Chart 4.4 Remarkable age differences in benefit reciprocity
