

Vandana Chandra is an economist in the World Bank's Economic Policy and Debt Department of the Poverty Reduction and Economic Management Network. In recent years she has worked on technological change, export diversification, competitiveness, and tertiary education in the context of economic growth in developing countries. She has edited a volume, *Technology, Adaptation and Exports: How Some Developing Countries Did It*, that discusses 10 case studies from a range of sectors - agriculture, horticulture, floriculture, forestry, fishery, electronics and software. The main objective of the book is to unravel how technological adaptation helped to scale up nascent export sectors in some countries and seed them in others. The crux of the cases is the role that government can play in fostering technological progress and enabling the private sector to grow in a fiercely competitive global market.
