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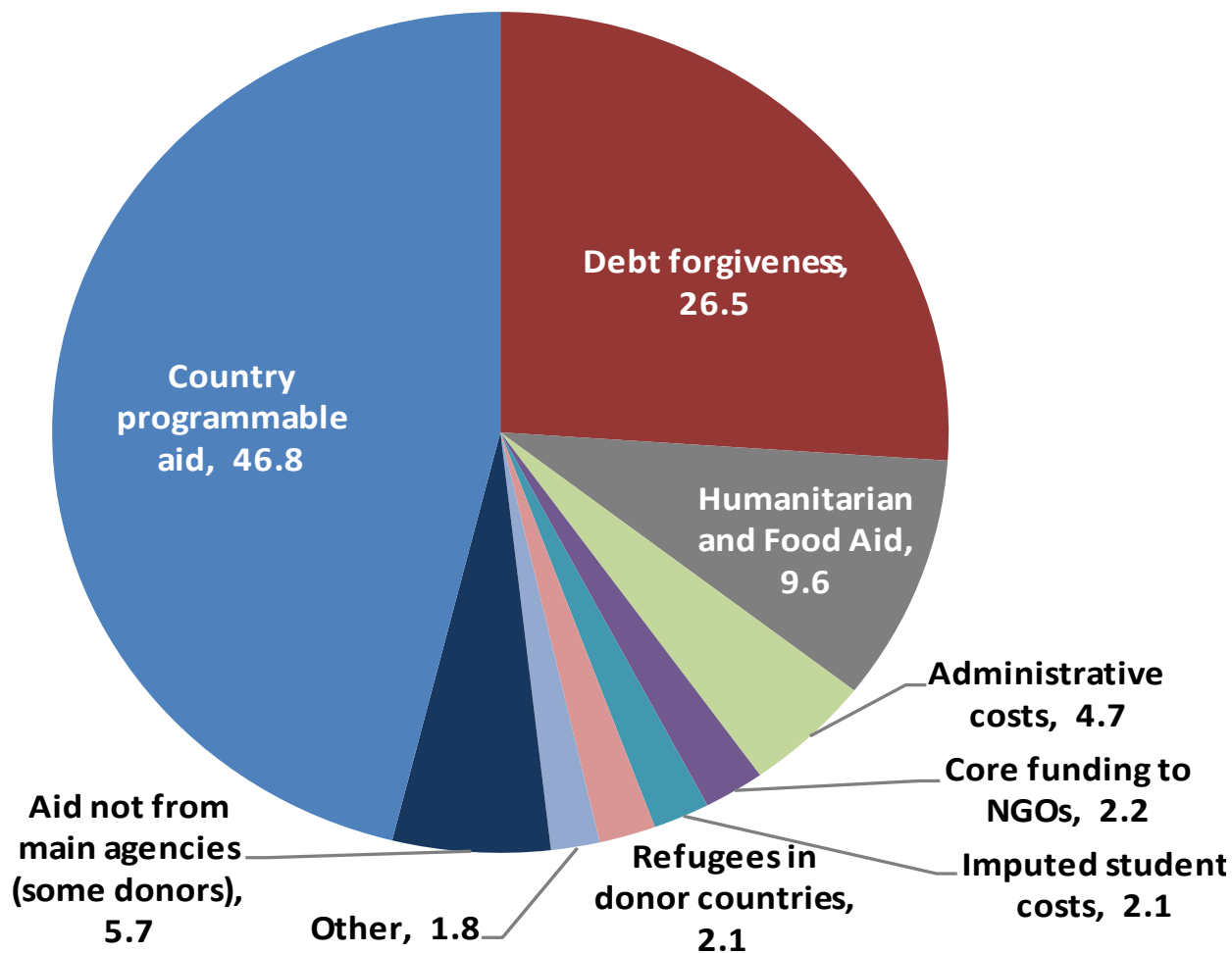
Strengthening Country Ownership

- Requires:
 - Predictable information on future aid flows
 - Capacity to budget for the medium term
 - Space in which to set policies
 - Involvement of all actors
- New DAC Survey of Forward Spending Plans
 - Published today, copies outside room

Country programmable aid: a pertinent measure

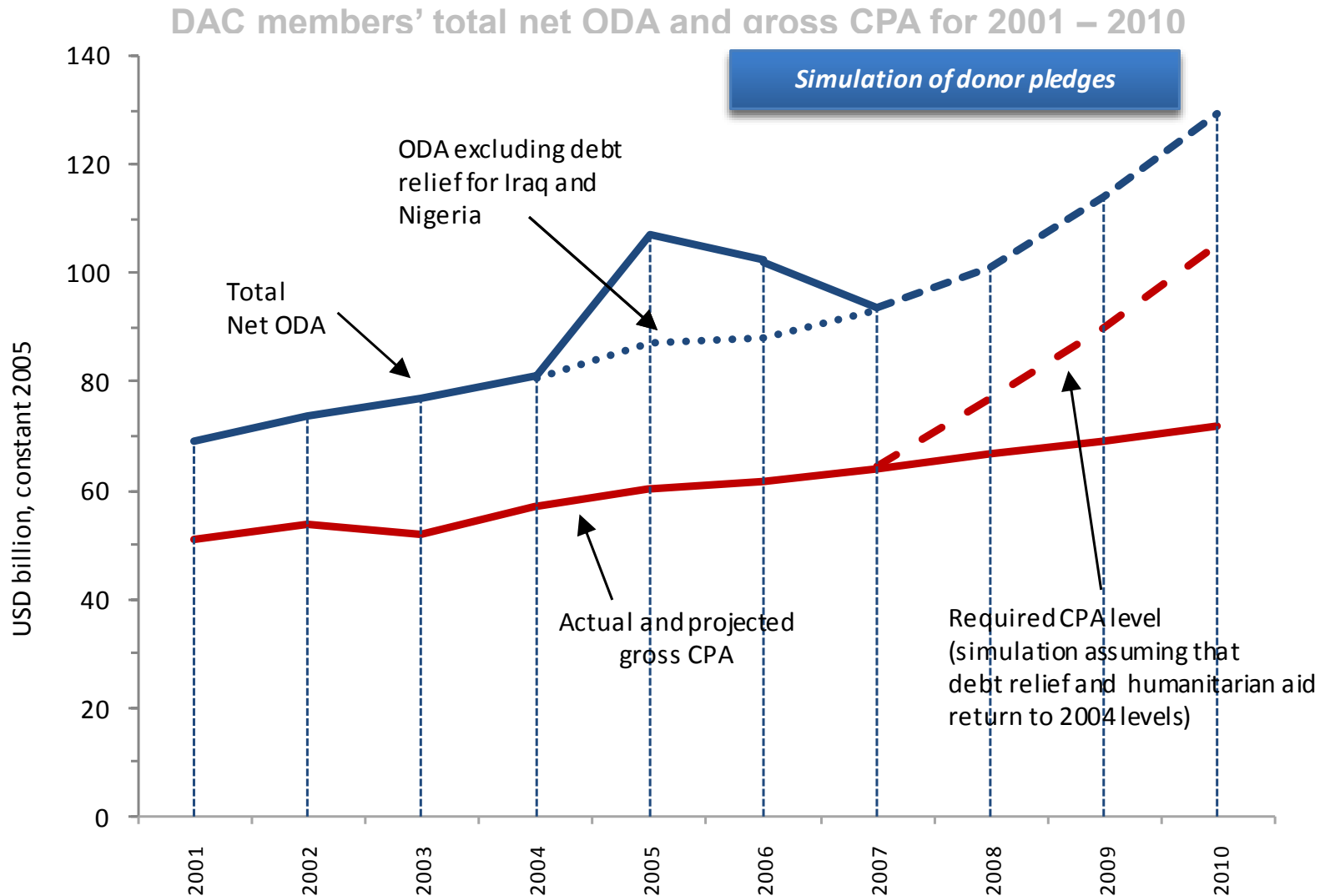
Around half ODA can be planned for in country budgets

Composition of gross bilateral ODA in 2005 (total USD 102 billion)



A gap to close

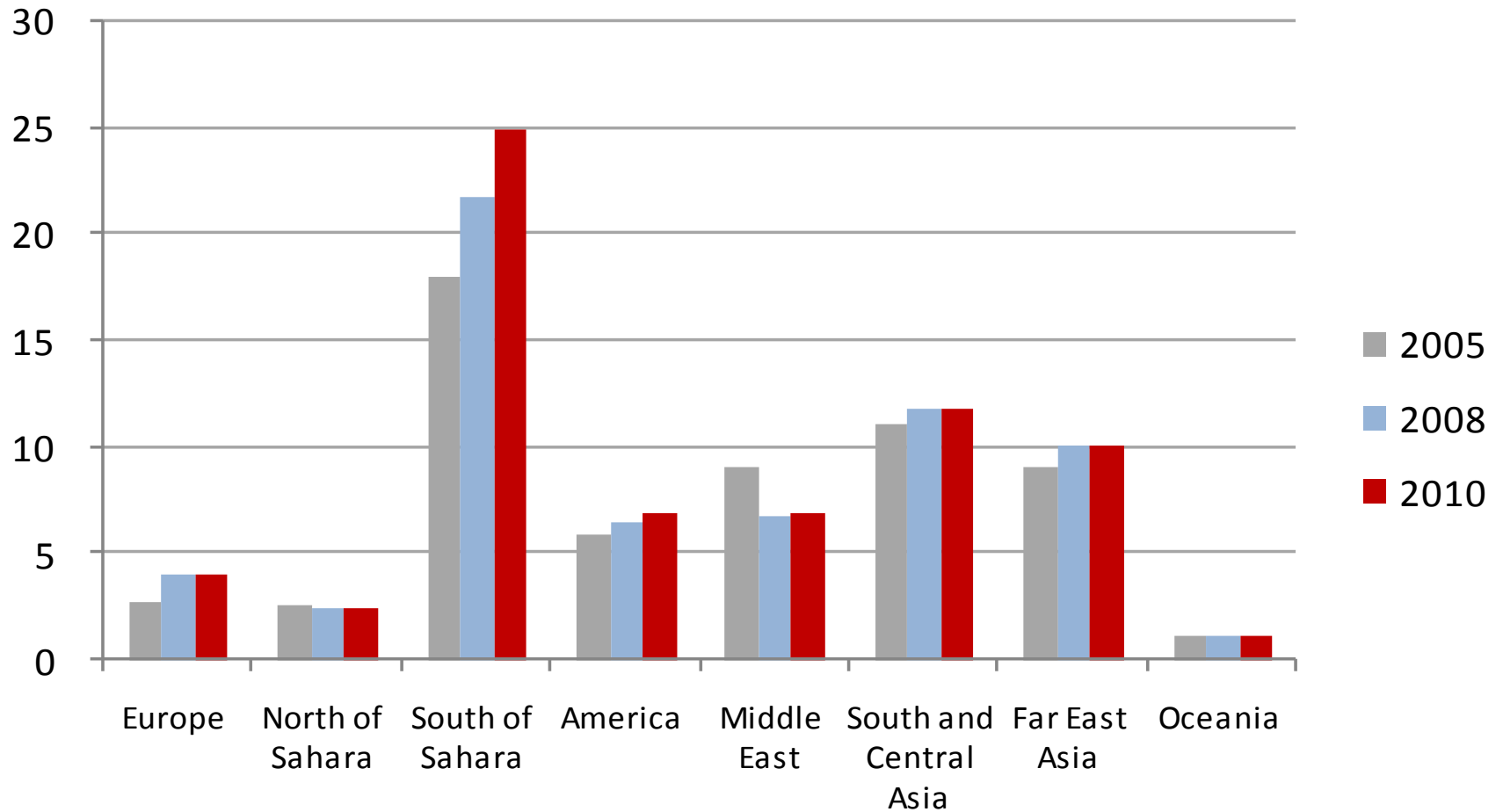
Still some USD 30 billion to be programmed to meet 2010 commitments



Scaling up

More aid for sub-Saharan Africa but well below commitments

(Gross CPA disbursements – constant 2005 USD billion)



Aid Fragmentation: too many donors contributing too little?

In 32 countries, 15 donors together provide just one tenth of their aid
