

Goran Hyden is Distinguished Professor in Political Science at the University of Florida, Gainesville in the U.S. He has been teaching also in Sweden and East Africa. His research interests lie in the interface between politics and development in comparative perspective but with a geographic focus on Africa. Over the past forty years he has published widely in this field focusing on policy analysis, public administration and most recently governance.

His books include "No Shortcuts to Progress: African Development Management in Perspective" (1983), "Governance and Politics in Africa" (1992), "Making Sense of Governance" (2004) and "African Politics in Comparative Perspective" (2006).

He has served as consultant to international agencies like the World Bank, African Development Bank, and UNICEF as well as bilateral agencies like Sida and NORAD. Since 2001 he has been associated with the World Governance Assessment (WGA) which began at the United Nations University in Tokyo and is currently working out of the Overseas Development Institute in London.
