Thursday, 6 March 2008

The first day will be **an OECD meeting** with the participation of accession and enhanced engagement countries to the OECD and some Middle East and North Africa (MENA) countries.

- *Session 1: Governments in 2020 – the role of e-government?*
 - Lessons learned from 10 years of e-government work in OECD countries: trends for the future?
 - Where is e-government going in 2020?
 - Participative e-government development – the impact of Web 2.0?
 - Demands on governments – how to prepare for future challenges.
 - Service delivery – the future role of governments.
- *Session 2: Parallel sessions on e-government's impact on economic development, focusing on skills and competencies for e-government development and public-private partnerships.*
- *Session 3: Creating the future agenda for e-government and public sector service delivery. Panel debate on the e-government agenda of the future.*

Friday, 7 March 2008

The second day will be **a meeting of the high-level representatives of the OECD Network of Senior E-Government Officials** and of the official observer countries to the Public Governance Committee. The meeting will cover the following issues:

- New strategic approaches to service delivery and user take-up.

- The challenge of collaboration and co-operation across levels of government.
- E-Government as a tool for administrative simplification.
- E-Government indicators: how do we identify and agree on them?
