The Role of Adjunct Faculty in Quality Teaching

Abstract

The CityU QT initiative has two parts. The first part is called the Adjunct Faculty Initiative. City University utilizes many adjunct practitioner faculties and this initiative is an effort to ensure that our adjuncts are delivering instruction in accordance with City University quality standards. We also must ensure that the adjunct faculty understand and act in accordance with the University's academic model. Second, we have a major initiative underway regarding our curriculum. In the School of Management, nearly every program has been rewritten or replaced in an effort to improve quality, ensure that standards are achieved, and make it easier for our adjunct faculty to deliver instruction that is in accordance with our academic model.
