Background

1. The third revision of the Standard International Trade Classification was approved by the Statistical Commission at its twenty-third session (1985). SITC, Rev.3 was defined in terms of the original Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS), which entered into force in 1988. The original HS was amended by the World Customs Organization (WCO) four times. Three amended editions of the HS went in force on 1 January of 1992, 1996 and 2002. The fourth amended edition of the HS will be effective beginning 1 January 2007. HS07 has 5052 subheadings of which 4208 are original HS88 subheadings. 844 non-original subheadings (17 %) were introduced in the subsequent HS editions (1 - in 1992, 267 - in 1996, 316 - in 2002 and 260 - in 2007; these counts are preliminary and are subject to the WCO confirmation).

2. In the past, in order to maintain continuity in SITC, Rev.3 series, the United Nations Statistics Division issued appropriate correlation tables between SITC, Rev.3 and each new edition of HS. However, a strict period-to-period comparability was being lost for a growing number of series due to significant changes in the HS classification scheme. New products, introduced in HS, were not properly reflected in SITC. At the same time, the majority of countries and international organizations continued to use SITC for various purposes, such as study of long-term trends in international trade and aggregation of traded commodities into classes more suitable for economic analysis. In this context the United Nations Statistical Commission, at its thirty-fifth session (2-5 March 2004), agreed with the conclusion of the inter-agency Task Force on International Merchandise Trade Statistics that the fourth revision of the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC, Rev.4) is needed in view of accumulated changes in HS. Accordingly, in mid 2004 UNSD began preparation of the SITC, Rev.4. The revision process was coordinated with the ongoing revision of CPC in order to synchronize these classifications as much as possible.

3. Provisional Draft of SITC, Rev.4, which is made available now for the peer review, has been completed on 15 August 2005. It is available on the UNSD website at:

Guidelines for the revision process

4. The main guidelines followed in the revision process are:

4.1 Scope of SITC, Rev. 4 is the same as of SITC, Rev.3; that is SITC Rev.4 covers all goods classifiable in HS except for monetary gold, gold coin and current coin.

4.2 All SITC, Rev.4 basic headings (except for 911.0 and 931.0) are defined in terms of HS07 subheadings. Revision includes deletion and addition of the basic headings of SITC. Scope of certain retained basic headings is to be modified. If scope modification is significant the involved heading is assigned a new code.

4.3 In 1993 HS was recommended by the UN Statistical Commission as the classification for use in compilation and dissemination of international merchandise trade statistics, and in 1999 the Commission confirmed its recognition of SITC as an analytical tool. Consequently, there is no need to create in SITC, Rev.4 new basic headings which are in one-to-one correspondence with the HS07 with the exception of several special cases explained below.

4.4 As a general rule, an SITC basic heading is:

deleted if (i) corresponding HS88 subheadings are deleted from HS07; (ii) its scope cannot be defined in terms of HS07 subheadings without significant change [this happens when involved HS88 subheadings are in a split correlation to HS07],

introduced if (i) several new HS subheadings can be grouped in an economically meaningful way and such a group fits into the classification scheme of SITC with no (or minimal) changes in the scope of the existing headings; (ii) some HS subheadings merit a separate identification in order to better reflect commodity structure and/or practice of customs recording of international trade, (iii) due to action in accordance with (i) and (ii), some HS subheadings could not be defined in terms of the existing basic SITC.

Summary of changes

5. SITC, Rev. 4 retains the overall structure of SITC, Rev.3 and consists of the same number of sections, divisions and groups. Changes are at the level of basic headings and some subgroups. 235 basic headings of SITC, Rev. 3 were deleted - most of them because of the reasons stated in paragraph 4.4 above. The reasons for exceptions from this rule are indicated in the comment column of Annex I. Annex I provides also an initial assessment of commodity transfers from the deleted headings to other SITC headings. The full description of such transfers will be provided in the forthcoming correlation tables. 85 new codes were introduced (see Annex II) in SITC, Rev. 4. The net result of those deletions and introduction is that SITC, Rev. 4 contains 2971 basic headings.

Description of major deletions

6. Section 6 of SITC, Rev. 3 has 82 deleted basic headings (35% of total). Out of these, 37 belong to division 67 and most of them are in group 673. The main reason for these deletions is the major rearrangement of HS92 headings 72.08 and 72.11 (products of flat-rolled iron or non-alloy steel) approved by the WCO on 6 July 1993.¹

7. Section 7 follows with 42 deletions out of which 12 are in group 751. The cause of these deletion is the contraction of HS92 heading 84.69 (typewriters) in to a single basic HS subheading and deletion of HS02 heading 90.09 (Photocopying apparatus incorporating an optical system or of the contact type and thermo-copying apparatus).²

8. Section 2 has 35 deletions. Group 265 (Vegetable textile fibres, other than cotton and jute, raw or processed but not spun; waste of these fibres) alone claim deletion of 8 basic headings. This is explained by the fact that all subheadings under HS02 53.04 and 53.05, to which group 265 was correlated, are deleted and represented by a single HS07 5305.00 subheading.³

9. 31 basic headings are deleted from Section 8. Out of these, 23 are from division 89 (Miscellaneous manufactured articles, n.e.s.). Deletion of HS02 headings 95.01 to 95.03 and creation of a single subheading 9503.00 to cover toys of all kinds, is the reason for deletion of eight SITC, Rev. 3 basic headings under subgroup 894.2. Similarly, the merging of headings HS02 85.23 and 85.24 (Discs, tapes, solid state non-volatile storage devices, "smart cards" and other media for the record of sound....) entails deletion of 10 basic headings in SITC rev. 3 subgroups 898.4 to 898.7 which were correlated to the above mentioned HS.⁴

10. The remaining deletions are distributed in the following manner: 20 in section 5, 11 in section 0, 8 in section 3, 5 in section 4, 1 in section 1 and 0 in section 9. All 8 deletions in section 3 belong to group 334 (Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, other than crude; preparations, n.e.s.....). Those SITC, Rev.3 heading were not defined in terms of HS88. Instead, SITC, Rev.4 introduces new codes by aggregating HS07 subheadings.

Description of the areas where new basic headings were introduced

11. Most of 844 non-original HS subheadings fall within the scope of the existing SITC, Rev.3 basic headings (note - in general, no new basic heading were introduced in SITC if non-original HS subheadings were within the scope of the existing ones). It was necessary, however, to create 85 new basic headings. Except for the cases mentioned below and, in addition, indicated in the comment column of Annex II, all new basic headings are introduced for the reason stated in paragraph 4.3 above. There is only one new SITC, Rev. 4 group (599) created to permit correspondence with HS heading 38.25 (Residual products of the chemical or allied industries, not elsewhere specified or included; municipal wastes; sewage sludge; other wastes) introduced by WCO in the HS2002 version.⁵

12. Out of the 85 new SITC, Rev. 4 basic headings, 32 are four-digit coded. 16 of the four-digit codes existed already in SITC, Rev.3 as a subgroup code (non-basic heading) subdivided in to two or more items. However, all the subdivisions (items) attached to each of these four-digit codes were deleted necessitating their conversion to basic headings in SITC, Rev. 4, either with the same or modified text to match the scope of the HS07 subheadings correlated to them. The remaining 16 are newly created basic headings to facilitate correlation with HS07. As examples for the later case, the following may be noted; the creation of 334.6 and 334.7 to facilitate the breakdown of "Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, other than crude...." in HS02 and the creation of 599.1 to 599.9 to facilitate the breakdown of "Residual products of the chemical or allied industries, not elsewhere specified or included; municipal wastes; sewage sludge; other wastes" introduced in HS02.

13. Section 7 has 29 new basic headings. They are introduced mainly to reflect products based on new technology, such as printing, copying and facsimile machines (HS07 84.43), machines for the manufacture of semiconductor boules, devices, electronic integrated circuits and flat panel displays (HS07 84.86), wireless networks and base stations (HS07 8517.6), monitors and projectors (85.28), electronic integrated circuits (HS07 8542.3) and the creation of a new heading for vacuum cleaners (HS07 85.08).⁶

14. Section 6 follows with 22 new SITC, Rev. 4 basic headings. The reasons for the creation of most these codes are the introduction of new HS subheadings such as bamboo (HS07 4412.10), oriented strand board (HS07 4411.1) and assembled flooring (HS07 4418.7). The simplification of wire of iron or non-alloy steel by omitting the reference to the carbon content of these products (which resulted in the deletion of 12 subheadings of HS96 72.17), necessitated creation of new codes in division 67 to reflect those changes in HS.

15. Section 5 has 13, section 8 has 8 and section 2 has 7 new basic headings. Sections 0 and 4 have 2 new basic headings each. Sections 1 and 9 have no new basic headings.

An invitation to provide comments

16. The Expert Group members are invited to comment on the Draft and send them to UNSD by mid October 2005. The EG comments will be reviewed together with comments provided by such fora as International Merchandise Trade Task Force and the UN Expert Group on Economic and Social Classifications. Taking into account all received inputs, UNSD will prepare the draft SITC, Rev.4 in the format suitable for submission to the Commission.
