

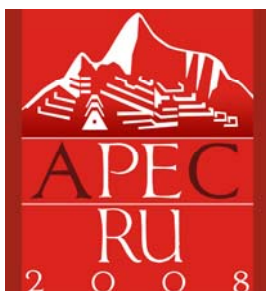

Bibliography of Resources on Competition Policy (revised)

1. Background

1.1 This paper was prepared by Hong Kong, China for the APEC Economic Committee (EC), which aims at inviting members' comments at 2008 EC I meeting on the proposed framework for assembling a bibliography of references on selected themes on competition policy. This bibliography identifies work done to date on competition policy within APEC and by other international organisations with a particular focus on contemporary work that is of broad relevance to all APEC economies. An extract of this bibliography is at Appendix I.

1.2 Upon completion, it will be made available to EC members on the APEC EC Collaboration Site. This bibliography will contribute to item 1c of the EC's forward work programme on competition policy, which was endorsed by APEC Ministers in August 2007.

2. Methodology

2.1 The compilation of the bibliography will take into account the previous work done by other APEC fora, in particularly the Competition Policy and Deregulation Group (CPDG), as well as other world organizations such as the OECD, WTO, World Bank etc. We will also incorporate recent research work surrounding some of the selected key elements of competition policy as discussed at 2007 EC II seminar on the role of competition policy in structural reform.

3. Proposed key areas of focus

3.1 The key elements that may be covered in the bibliography should reflect the role of competition policy in an economy, and shed light on APEC's competition policy agenda. In this respect, the following areas may be identified as the key focus of the bibliography of resources on competition policy:

- Competition policy and investment, innovation and productivity
- Competition policy and market efficiency
- Competition policy and economic growth and development
- Challenges in setting up competition regimes
- Promotion of competition culture

4. Way Forward

4.1 In the course of preparing this bibliography of resources, we will consult the FotC group on Competition Policy, CPDG and other relevant APEC fora. EC members are also welcome to provide research and/or study reports conducted in their respective economies in relation to the proposed key elements of competition policy.

4.2 The key elements stated in para. 3.1 do not intend to be exhaustive. Members' comments and advice are sought for the key areas of focus proposed for the bibliography.
