1) Background

The OECD DAC Network on Environment and Development Co-operation and the Poverty-Environment Partnership Network (PEP) are tracking their members' country-level activities related to environment and development through a regularly updated Survey. The *Survey of agencies' country level activities* aims to provide an overview of "who is doing what and where", with a view to facilitate collaboration between agencies. Shared analysis and strengthened capacity by co-ordinated donor support are among the main objectives of the *Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness*.

2) Changes from previous iterations

This version is an update of the previous version, based on members' submissions to the Secretariat by the end of April 2007. It is produced for the ENVIRONET meeting in May 2007. The format and scope of this version remain the same as the previous version that has been produced for the last ENVIRONET meeting in November 2006.

The previous version had been revised in line with the proposals during the ENVIRONET meeting in February 2006: the categories "EFR" and "Greening' of PRSPs" had been combined and a category on "Climate Change adaptation" had been added. A category entitled "Other Activities undertaken in response to the *Paris Declaration*" had also been included, providing the possibility to report initiatives which are not covered in any of the other categories.

In addition, note that activities related to Strategic Environmental Assessment are treated in a separate survey carried out by the DAC SEA Task Team.

Moreover, a distinction is made in each category between activities related to "analytical work", "capacity development/institutional strengthening", "policy development" and "other activities" (see point 3 below).

3) Thematic coverage

The *Survey of agencies' country level activities* offers an overview of ongoing or recently finalised activities at country-level, aiming to facilitate the sharing of experiences. The information will be made public and published on the ENVIRONET web site.

The Survey is divided into the following categories of activities:

I. Environmental Fiscal Reform (EFR) and "Greening" of PRSPs

In this category, please report activities such as studies of EFR instruments and measures, and reviews of environment mainstreaming in PRSPs.

II. Climate Change adaptation

In this category, please report activities such as capacity building to support climate change adaptation.

For a complete overview of efforts taken by agencies to adapt to climate change (not only country-level activities), see the forthcoming report of the "Stock-taking of progress on adaptation to climate change in development co-operation activities" conducted by the OECD Secretariat in 2006/2007.

III. Other initiatives undertaken in response to the Paris Declaration

In this category, please report other activities which are related to the recommendations in the *Paris Declaration*. These may include support to or participation in an in-country coordination mechanism, capacity development or shared analysis on a subject which is not treated in category I or II.

Each of the three categories above is separated into sub-categories, to help distinguish whether the activity is related to:

- Analytical work
- Capacity development/Institutional strengthening
- Policy development
- Other (e.g. in-country co-ordination mechanisms)

4) Regional coverage

The Survey is divided into four regions: Africa and the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific, Latin America and Caribbean, Eastern Europe and Balkans.
