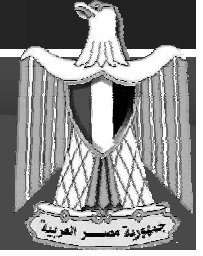

# Egyptian Law

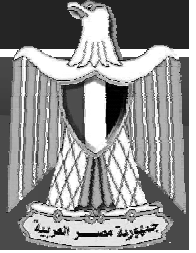


- Egypt is utilizing now law 89 issued in 1998 which regulate the procurement processes of tenders and auctions.
- This law is subject to change in the near future to reflect the use of E-Procurement in Egypt.

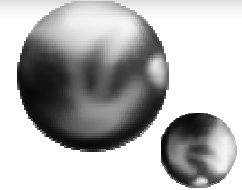




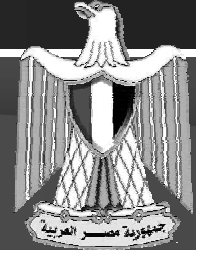
# Steps to change the law



Many organizations reviewed the current law and defined which articles need to be changed to reflect the use of E-Procurement.

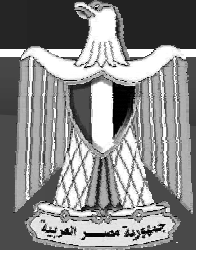


# Law changes Suggestions



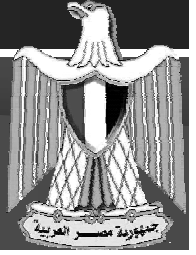
- **Current:** Tenders announcements must be in 2 wide spread newspapers.
- **Change:** Tenders announcements can be published on the internet.

# Law changes Suggestions

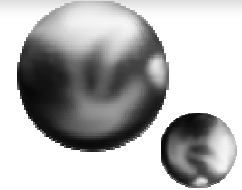


- **Current:** Bids must be presented by the supplier in 2 closed envelopes till the unsealing session.
- **Change:** Bids can be presented electronically and they will be encrypted till the unsealing session.

# Law changes Suggestions

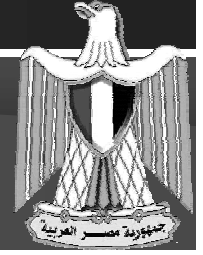


- **Current**: Supplier bids are identified by the supplier stamp.
- **Change**: Supplier bids are identified by the supplier e-signature.





# Barriers & Solutions

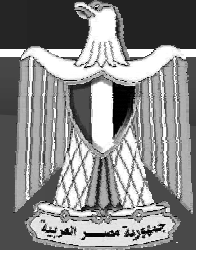


- **Barrier:** Low internet usage by Egyptian suppliers.
- **Solution:** Awareness campaign on using the internet and especially the E-Procurement portal.
