

David Booth is a Research Fellow in the Politics and Governance cluster at the Overseas Development Institute in London, where he has worked since 1998. Trained as a sociologist, he was a Professor of Development Studies at the University of Wales Swansea and previously a staff member in Sociology and Anthropology at the University of Hull. He is interested in institutional issues in aid and development, and in particular in the operationalisation of the idea of country-led development. He has led Drivers of Change exercises and programme evaluations for DFID and other agencies, and has recently brought to completion a two-year research project on Good Governance, Aid Modalities and Poverty Reduction for the Advisory Board of Irish Aid (ABIA). He is also Director of the Africa Power and Politics Programme funded by DFID's Central Research Department and the ABIA, and the Editor of *Development Policy Review*.
