
Adam Posen is Deputy Director of the Peterson Institute for International Economics in Washington, DC, where he has been a Senior Fellow since 1997. His research covers macroeconomic and financial policy, the political economy of Western Europe and Japan, and central banking issues. Dr. Posen is the author, co-author, or editor of five books, including *The Euro at Five: Ready for a Global Role?* (IIE), *Inflation Targeting: Lessons from the International Experience* (with B. Bernanke et al., Princeton), and *Restoring Japan's Economic Growth* (IIE), and has published a number of widely-cited studies in monetary economics. The Institute will publish his new book, *Reform and Growth in a Rich Country: Germany*, in 2008. He received his Ph.D. from Harvard University. He has been a consultant to the US Council of Economic Advisers, Departments of State and Treasury, the European Commission, the International Monetary Fund, and to central banks worldwide. During 2006, he was on sabbatical as Houblon-Norman Senior Fellow at the Bank of England. Dr. Posen is a frequent contributor to opinion pages of the *Financial Times* and is a columnist for the German newspaper *Welt am Sonntag* and for *The International Economy* magazine. As Peterson's Deputy Director, he oversees finances, fundraising, administration, and recruiting for the Institute's \$9 million annual budget and staff of fifty.
