

## OECD Standardised Unemployment Rates

### News Release

#### OECD Standardised Unemployment Rate remains stable at 5.5% in February 2008

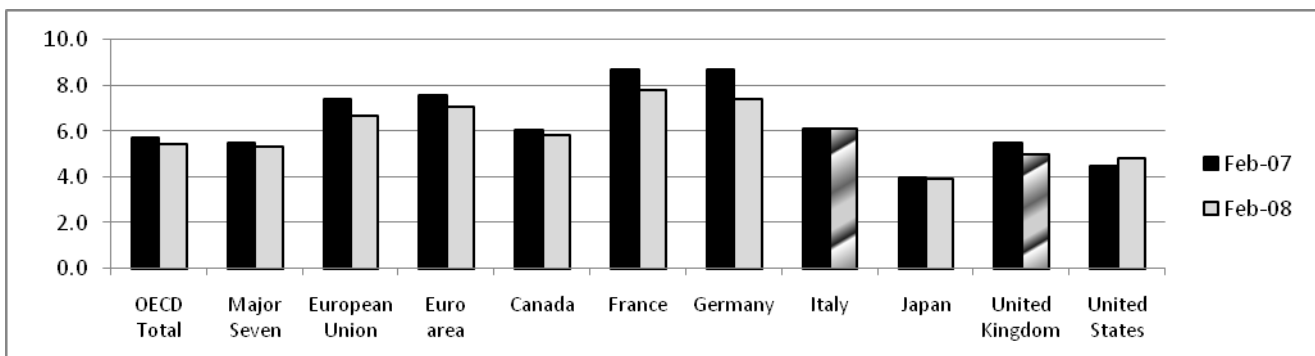
The standardised unemployment rate for the **OECD area** was 5.5% in February 2008, the same as the previous month and 0.2 percentage point lower than a year earlier.

In the **Euro area**, the standardised unemployment rate was 7.1% in February 2008, the same as the previous month and 0.5 percentage point lower than a year earlier. The **United States'** standardised unemployment rate for *March* 2008 was 5.1%, 0.3 percentage point higher than the previous month and 0.7 percentage point higher than a year earlier. For **Japan**, the rate was 3.9% in February 2008, 0.1 percentage point higher than the previous month but 0.1 percentage point lower than in February 2007.

In February 2008, the standardised unemployment rate in **France** was 7.8%, the same as the previous month and 0.9 percentage point lower than a year earlier. For **Germany**, the rate was 7.4% in February 2008, 0.2 percentage point lower than the previous month and 1.3 percentage point lower than in February 2007. For **Canada**, the standardised unemployment rate was 6.0% in *March* 2008, 0.2 percentage point higher than the previous month but 0.1 percentage point lower than a year earlier. In *December* 2007, the rate in the **United Kingdom** was 5.0%, the same as the previous month and 0.4 percentage point lower than a year earlier. In *December* 2007, the standardised unemployment rate in **Italy** was 6.1%, the same as the previous month and 0.3 percentage point lower than a year earlier.

## OECD Standardised Unemployment Rates

---

### Methodological Notes

The OECD standardised unemployment rates, compiled for 27 OECD member countries, are based on definitions of the 13th Conference of Labour Statisticians (generally referred to as the ILO guidelines). Under these definitions, the unemployed are persons of working age who, in the reference period, are without work, are available for work and have taken specific steps to find work.

The uniform application of the definitions results in estimates that are more internationally comparable than those based on national definitions. For example, national unemployment data in some countries only include persons registered at government labour offices. Under the ILO definition, persons without work who are seeking employment through other means can also be classified as unemployed and registrants can be excluded if they worked or were not available for work. The standardised unemployment rates shown here are calculated as the number of unemployed persons as a percentage of the civilian labour force (i.e., the unemployed plus those in civilian employment). The standardised unemployment rates are seasonally adjusted.

The standardised unemployment rates for the European Union (EU) member countries and Norway are produced by the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat). The OECD is responsible for collecting data and calculating standardised unemployment rates for the remaining countries.

In September 2000, Eurostat adopted a new unemployment definition through a Commission Regulation. Details about the new definition and its implementation are available on the [Eurostat Internet site](#). This link also gives details about country specific estimations and provisional data.

Monthly figures include OECD Secretariat estimates for countries which only compile quarterly rates.
