Conscious of the obstacles facing developing countries in their efforts at trade participation, UNIDO has realigned its technical assistance approach and established a trade capacity-building branch in early 2006, shortly following the December 2005 WTO Ministerial Conference.

UNIDO's strategy is built on the principle of forming strategic partnerships with other multilateral and technical organizations and agencies such as WTO, ITC, FAO, ISO, ILAC, BIPM and IAF, in order to maximize the efficiency and effectiveness of trade-related technical support and is based on a three-pronged strategy known as the 3Cs:

- **Compete:** remove supply side constraints and increase the competitiveness of the industrial sector.
- **Conform:** enable products to conform to market requirements (standards, technical regulations and conformity assessment procedures) and overcome barriers to trade.
- **Connect:** enable producers to connect with the market and integrate in the multilateral trading system.

Key objective of UNIDO Aid for Trade activities is to support developing countries in their efforts to offer competitive, safe, reliable and cost-effective products to the world markets. UNIDO concentrates its efforts on developing competitive productive capacity through enterprise upgrading and the creation of conformity assessment infrastructure complying with the WTO SPS and TBT agreements as well as voluntary standards. This approach was also endorsed through a Memorandum of Understanding signed between UNIDO and WTO in 2005.

As a specialized agency of the United Nations, UNIDO TCB programme undertakes almost all of its technical assistance activities with financial support from donors, such as the European Union, Austria, France, Italy, Japan, Norway, Switzerland, Sweden and the United Kingdom, either in the form of project-based financing or trust funds. The organization itself has very limited funds to finance projects apart from seed funding for project formulation.

Since 2007, UNIDO's Aid for Trade strategy has evolved to answer to the increasing demands from member states in formulating comprehensive programmes in cooperation with sister UN agencies and specialized technical organizations. UNIDO participates actively in the UN-CEB Inter-agency Cluster on Productive Capacity and Trade which is aimed to strengthen the UN response to the "Aid for Trade" initiative. UNIDO have coordinated the establishment and publication of the first edition (2008) of the UN agency Trade Capacity Building Inter-Agency Resource Guide. A 2009 edition, with more participating agencies and with updated service descriptions, is foreseen as a further contribution to the AfT initiative.

UNIDO has been working towards increasing its participation in the Aft/EIF process and is developing pilot technical assistance (TA) projects covering supply-side and conformity infrastructure development in line with Aft/EIF requirements and best practice guidelines. As a first phase UNIDO have identified eight LDCs (Benin, Cambodia, Lao PDR, Lesotho, Mozambique, Rwanda, Senegal, and Yemen) as meeting the necessary criteria for analysis. Draft proposals for programmes for these countries were presented and validated at a meeting in Kigali at the beginning of September and were tabled for approval and funding at the High-Level LDC Ministerial Conference held in Cambodia on 19-20 November.

As mentioned above, UNIDO Aid for Trade projects are 90% funded through bilateral and multi-donor financing and trust-funds. Therefore, our forward commitments are a function of the next years' implementation budget of our ongoing projects plus the future disbursements for the hard-pipeline projects. According to UNIDO's data the approved and hard pipeline projects for the period 2009-2012 for UNIDO Aid for Trade activities amount to US\$102 million.

Mainstreaming and Ownership

UNIDO established its Trade Capacity Building branch in early 2006, to streamline its ongoing trade-related assistance activities especially in the field of quality infrastructure and conformity-, which were initiated 30 years ago. Today, Trade Capacity Building is one of the three thematic priorities of UNIDO along with Poverty Reduction through Productive Activities and Energy and Environment. In the short period since its establishment, Trade Capacity Building Branch has been going from strength to strength, both in terms of increasing its in-house expertise and also reinforcing its strategic partnerships.

UNIDO's Aid-for-Trade strategy is effectively integrated through all the activities of the Organization and goes beyond the mandate of a single branch. UNIDO offers assistance in the form of packages of mutually supportive service modules including enterprise upgrading, promotion of investment and technology management, cleaner production, cluster development, and export consortia.

In addition to the available expertise in the headquarters, UNIDO's field network of 30 Field Offices, 13 units, 19 Investment and Technology Promotion Offices, 10 Industrial Technology Centers and 34 National Clean Production Centers/networks support the work of the UNIDO Trade Capacity Building programme.

Currently UNIDO is undertaking a thematic evaluation of its Standards, Metrology, Testing and Quality (SMTQ) Infrastructure related projects. This thematic evaluation aims at recommendations and lessons learned that should help further improve UNIDO performance and develop an impact assesment methodology not only in the specific area of Quality Infrastructure but also for Aid for Trade projects in general. The thematic evaluation includes reviewing evaluation reports of terminated projects; carrying out evaluations of projects coming to an end in 2008; analysis of the approach and design of the latest generation of ongoing and forthcoming projects and an assessment of UNIDO's thematic leadership through "Global Forum" activities.

SMTQ projects aim at building, improving or consolidating the "National Quality System" (NQS) of developing countries. Although focusing on the "comply" area, such projects cannot be evaluated without taking into account the "compete" and "connect" aspects. The relevance of a SMTQ project critically depends on the existence of competitive companies that are connected to export markets and their active involvement in the project. Building or strengthening a NQS without a solid participation of the private sector users of the NQS would be ineffective.

Many years of practical experience led UNIDO to realise that addressing trade capacity issues at the sub-regional level stimulates greater market integration and can result in penetration of global value chains possibly beyond the reach of individual countries. Sub-regional projects can also be more cost effective – one common accreditation body may, for example, be sufficient for a group of countries. UNIDO cooperates with regional organizations such as UEMOA, ECOWAS, EAC and SAARC in implementing trade capacity building projects as part of regional planning and budgeting framework such as the EU UEMOA Quality Programme that is being executed by UNIDO.

Being involved into the WTO trade liberalization processes, including EU/ACP Economic Partnership Agreements (EPAs) and “Aid for Trade Initiative”, UNIDO is currently on the way to finalize formulation of large sub-regional programmes on industrial upgrading and modernization for 5 Africa, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) Regional Economic Communities (RECs) covering 62 developing countries.

Numerous meetings and workshops were held to discuss and amend the draft regional upgrading programmes taking into account the recommendations and priority needs of the regional communities and their Member States. As a result of these meetings and work carried out in the field and in Vienna in close cooperation with RECs and EC, 4 African Sub-Regional Upgrading and Modernization Programmes were validated by respective RECs (ECOWAS/UEMOA, SADC, COMESA and CEMAC/ECCAS). The validation workshop for the CARIFORUM Programme Proposal is scheduled for the first quarter of 2009. Discussions with EU/AIDCO on the EPA programmes’ contents and the EU funding of these programmes started in June 2008 and are currently on the way. The discussions on possible co-funding are also ongoing with the AFD, which agreed in principle to contribute to the financing
