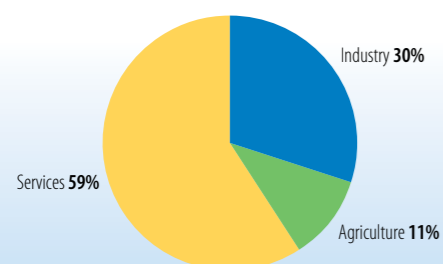


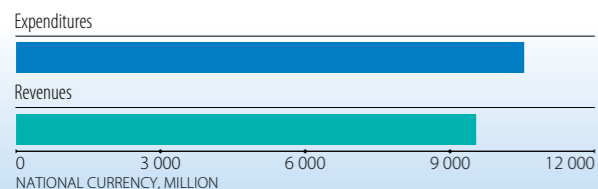

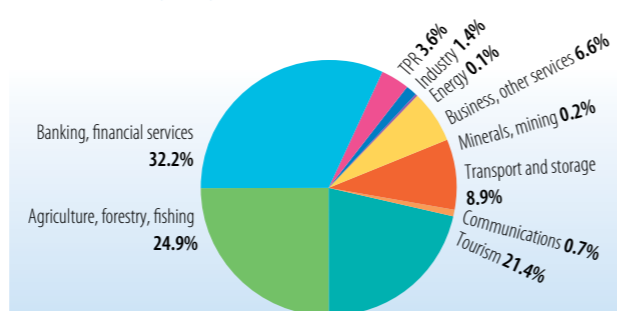

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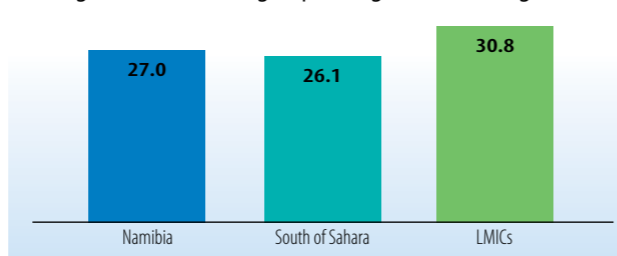

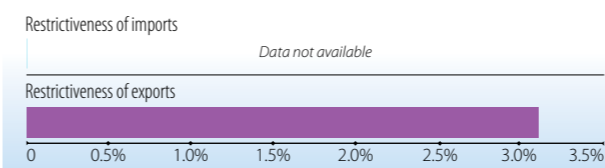

Trade is **partly** mainstreamed in the national development plan and also addressed in the **annual budget**.

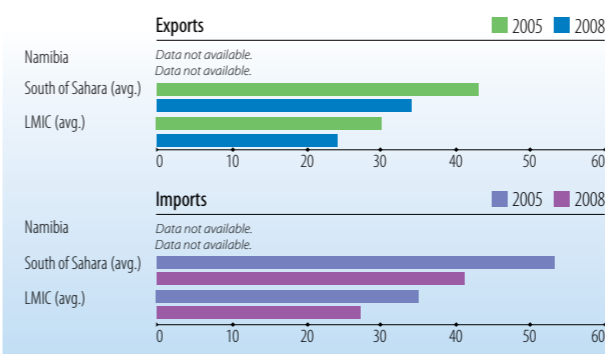

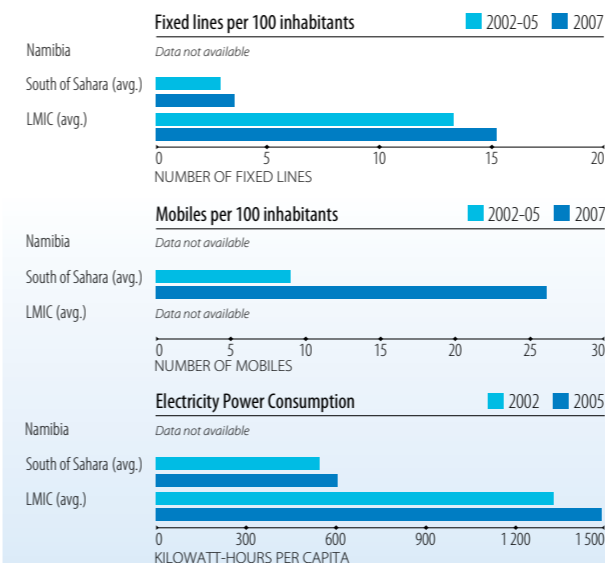

Number of days for trading across borders

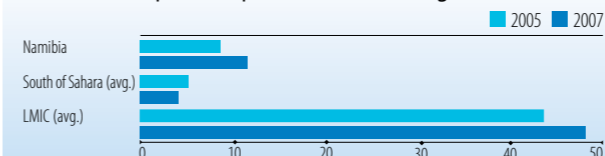


PRIORITY 2: NETWORK INFRASTRUCTURE¹⁴



PRIORITY 3: EXPORT DIVERSIFICATION¹⁵

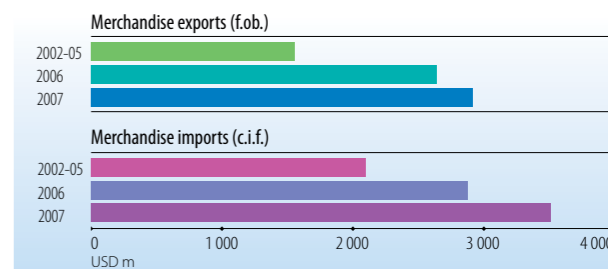
Product diversification (Number of equivalent products at SITC 3-digits)



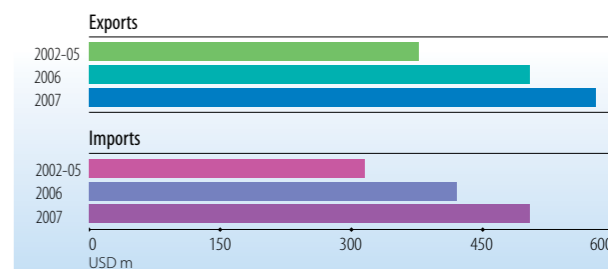

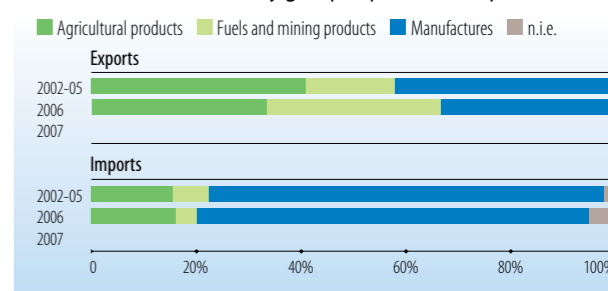
