REPIN – A REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP FOR BETTER ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY IMPLEMENTATION

The Regulatory Environmental Programme Implementation Network (REPIN) was created in 1999 in Chisinau under the OECD/EAP Task Force umbrella as a mechanism for dialogue on issues of environmental compliance assurance in Eastern Europe, Caucasus, and Central Asia (EECCA). Over its ten-year history, the Network evolved and currently its scope of work covers environmental policy implementation and financing.

The Network gathers policy makers from environmental ministries and environmental enforcement managers/practitioners, as well as representatives of the non-governmental sector. REPIN is open to the participation of officials and experts from OECD countries and Central and Eastern Europe (CEE) and facilitates the know-how transfer and donor assistance to network members.

The Network holds annual meetings to discuss and agree on the work programme, country-specific projects, and to monitor their implementation. The REPIN's working methods emphasise policy dialogue and peer learning, and analysis and good practice guidance to support reform efforts.

The REPIN work has helped to revise policies and legislation, to reform environmental enforcement institutions, and to upgrade the knowledge and skills of environmental officials and experts. A suite of practical tools to assist EECCA governments to implement reforms have been developed. Country-specific demonstration projects have been used to both design and apply such tools.

REPIN is a member of the International Network for Environmental Compliance and Enforcement (INECE). This work also draws from, and, where appropriate, contributes to, activities of other international partnerships, including the IMPEL Network of the European Union (EU) and the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Network for Accession (ECENA).
