



Ambassador **Ingrid Brocková** took up her duties as Permanent Representative of the Slovak Republic to the OECD on 16 January 2018.

Ms. Brocková was born in 1963. She holds a Doctorate in Economics from the Slovak Technical University, Bratislava, which she obtained in 1991. In 1999 she obtained a Masters in International Public Policy from the SAIS, Johns Hopkins University, Washington D.C.

From 1989 to 1991, Ms. Brocková was a Financial Officer in ZSNP a.s. In 1993, she entered the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, serving as Deputy Director of the Department of International Economic Cooperation. Then, in 1996, she was posted to the Embassy of the Slovak Republic to the United States where she served as Economic Officer. In 2000, she returned to Bratislava and was appointed Deputy Director of the Policy Planning Department at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, later in 2001 she became Director of the Department. From 2001 to 2008, she served as Country Manager at the World Bank office in Bratislava.

Prior to her nomination as Ambassador and Permanent Representative of the Slovak Republic to the OECD, Ambassador Brocková served as Director General for Economic Cooperation at the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Slovak Republic from September 2, 2015 – November 1, 2017. From October 18, 2011 – August 31, 2015 she served as Ambassador and Permanent Representative of the Slovak Republic to the OECD.
