



Sylvain GIGUÈRE is the Head of the Local Employment, Skills and Social Innovation (LESI) Division and the LEED Programme of the OECD. Sylvain leads a cross-cutting policy research agenda to help governments achieve better results on jobs, growth, productivity and inclusion and reports to the LEED Directing Committee, a governing board of 34 countries. The LEED Programme works extensively with emerging economies, policy officers at all levels and practitioners around the world through the Trento Centre and its capacity building mission, the LEED Forum and its 3 500 field experts on economic development, employment, skills and social inclusion in 65 countries, and ESSSA, a platform supporting knowledge exchange on employment and skills strategies in Southeast Asia. LEED also contributes to the work of the G20, APEC, ILO and ASEAN. Sylvain joined the OECD in 1995 to work on the OECD Jobs Strategy and in 2002 became Deputy Head of LEED, where he developed work on integrated policy implementation. In 2008, he was appointed Head of LEED and, in 2017, Head of the LESI Division. Sylvain studied Economics at Queen's University (Kingston, Ont.), UQAM (Montreal) and University Paris I Pantheon-Sorbonne, where he obtained a PhD in Economics.
