14:00-16:30	From e-Government to Digital Government Strategies in the MENA region
	<p>This session will serve to present and discuss the results of the report of the MENA-OECD Governance Programme on Benchmarking Digital Government Strategies in MENA Countries, assessed on the basis of the OECD Recommendation on Digital Government. It will also present the preliminary version of the Digital Government Review of Morocco, which analyses the policy framework as well as recent efforts made by Morocco to support a more strategic use of digital technologies. The report includes an assessment of the risks and challenges that should be managed, and what should be the policy implications of these challenges. The OECD will also provide a quick update on the Open Data work, focusing on the enabling conditions for the sustainable implementation of relevant policies and initiatives.
