IEG/DAC EVALUATION NETWORK JOINT WORKSHOP ON EVALUATING SUPPORT TO PRIVATE SECTOR DEVELOPMENT

I. Opening session (9:00-9:30)

1. The opening session will set the stage for the workshop with a discussion of why it is important to look at support to the private sector in today's development context.

II. Development Perspectives from the Private Sector (9:30-10:30)

2. This session will highlight the perspectives and roles of private sector actors in development co-operation. It will be moderated by Marvin Taylor-Dormond, Director of Private Sector Evaluation, Independent Evaluation Group (IEG), World Bank Group, and feature presentations from Frank Nagel, Head of Banking Advisory, RaboBank, and Olivier de Norey, Ports and Terminals Director, Bolloré Africa Logistics.

III. Public Funding for Private Sector Development: Evaluators' Perspective (11:00-12:30)

3. This session will focus on key concepts in evaluating private sector support and look at approaches to private sector evaluations. Rakesh Nangia, Director, Operations Evaluation Department, African Development Bank, will moderate the session. There will be presentations by Nigel Twose, Private Sector M&E Practitioner; Eva Terberger, Head of the Financial Co-operation Evaluation Department, KfW Entwicklungsbank, Germany; and Jim Tanburn, Co-ordinator of the Donor Committee for Enterprise Development (DCED).

IV. Thematic Session One: Evaluation of Programmes Targeting Small- and Medium-Sized Enterprises (SMEs) (14:00-15:00)

4. The first of two thematic sessions will focus on evaluating programmes aimed at supporting small- and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). Participants will discuss recent evaluations of programmes supporting small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in developing countries, describing both the evaluation approaches used and policy lessons. This session will be chaired by Odile Conchou, Director, Environmental and Social Impacts, Proparco. Simon Calvert, Private Sector and Growth Evaluation Adviser Department for International Development (DFID), U.K. will present findings from a review of evaluations of market system projects. A representative of the European Investment Bank will share work on targeted SME finance. Jack Glen, IEG, World Bank Group, will present emerging findings from IEG's evaluation of SMEs.

V. Thematic Session Two: Evaluation of Public Private Partnerships (15:30-16:30)

5. The second thematic session will focus on public private partnerships (PPPs), examining recent evaluations of public-private partnerships in development co-operation and looking at evaluation approaches and findings. Thierry Déau, Founding Partner, Chief Executive Officer, Meridam Infrastructure will moderate the session. Ruerd Ruben (Head of Operations Evaluation Department (IOB) Netherlands) will present a systematic review of partnerships in Netherlands development co-operation. Lauren Hauck, Senior Evaluation Specialist, Independent Evaluation Department, Asian Development Bank will share recent work on PPPs in Asia.

VI. Closing and Next Steps (16:30-17:00)

6. Martyn Pennington (Head of Evaluation Department, Europe Aid and Chair of the OECD DAC Network on Development Evaluation) and Marvin Taylor-Dormond (Director Private Sector Evaluation, IEG World Bank Group) will close the workshop with a short wrap-up and a forward-looking discussion of possible avenues for further collaboration.

The DAC Network on Development Evaluation at 30: Accomplishments, Evolution & Future Challenges – 30th Anniversary Celebration (17:00-19:30)

7. On the occasion of the 30-year anniversary of the first meeting of the DAC's subsidiary body on evaluation, this session will look at the past accomplishments of the group, how the work programme has evolved over time and future challenges facing evaluation and the Network. Niels Dabelstein, Consultant and former Chair of the Network, will present a report on the history of the group, which will be followed by a forward-looking discussion.

8. Directly after the discussion there will be a cocktail reception in the Marshall Room of the Chateau de la Muette to celebrate 30 years of the DAC Network on Development Evaluation. Jon Lomoy, Director of the Development Co-operation Directorate, OECD, will mark the occasion and launch the OECD DAC publication: *12 Lessons on Evaluating International Development Activities*.

Wednesday 19 June

MEETING OF THE DAC NETWORK ON DEVELOPMENT EVALUATION

I. Opening Session (9:30-10:00)

9. The meeting will open with approval of the Summary Record of the 14th Meeting of the DAC Network on Development Evaluation [DCD/DAC/EV/A(2012)2] and the Agenda for the 15th meeting [DCD/DAC/EV/A(2013)1]. New members and guests will be invited to introduce themselves briefly.

II. Building a Culture of Evaluation (10:00-12:00)

10. This session will look at how evaluation units can help create a learning culture in development agencies.

- Cynthia Clapp-Wincek, Director of the Office of Learning, Evaluation and Research, United States Agency for International Development (USAID), will kick off the discussion with a presentation of work on building a learning culture at USAID and efforts to strengthen monitoring and evaluation capacities.
- Mohamed Hedi Manaï, Division Manager, Operations Evaluation Department, African Development Bank (AfDB) will share thinking on how evaluation can promote a learning culture in an institution and present some of AfDB's new work in this area.
- Dereck Rookan-Smith, Assistant Director General, Office of Development Effectiveness (ODE), AusAID, will describe recent work on results in AusAID and the evolving role of ODE.

11. There will be an opportunity for other members to share experiences and discuss current efforts to help strengthen professional competencies in evaluation – in the evaluation unit and beyond. Participants will also discuss ways to raise the profile of evaluation and advocate for use, and explore how members can best support decentralised and self-evaluations.

III. Updates on On-Going Work and Proposals for Future Collaboration (12:00-13:00)

12. This session provides an opportunity to discuss on-going work and for members to share ideas.

- The Secretariat will provide an update on OECD DAC priorities, including efforts to enlarge the membership of the committee and engage with other providers of development assistance. The Chair will give an update on Network engagement and invite the group to discuss ways of supporting new and potential DAC members in evaluation.
- The Secretariat will inform the Network about a recent Policy Dialogue on Triangular Co-operation and interest in evaluating these partnerships.
- Riitta Oksanen (Finland) will share a proposal for work on evaluating human rights and gender equality, for discussion.
- The Secretariat will provide a short report on implementation of the 2011/2012 programme of work, including a collection of resources for communicating evaluation findings and a short update on the evaluation plans database. The Chair will invite input on work to which members will contribute. The floor will then be open for sharing future evaluation work and ideas for collaboration
- Network bureau election: The Secretariat will open the floor for nominations of one vice-chair.

IV. Multilateral Effectiveness (14:30-16:00)

13. Members will provide updates on on-going work on assessing the effectiveness of multilateral organisations:

- The Secretariat will provide a short introduction with background on the topic of assessing multilateral organisations.
- Consultant Ian Davies will present findings from a review of the UNEG-DAC peer review "Lessons-Learned Study of Peer Reviews of UNEG Evaluation Function experiences," for discussion by members. Ted Kliet (Netherlands) and Indran Naidoo (UNDP) will provide an

update on the peer reviews. Members will be asked to decide on a successor to represent the Network in the joint task team.

- Canada will provide an update on the development effectiveness reviews of multilateral organisations, with a focus on findings from recent studies, including the recently completed UNICEF review.
- Björn Gillsäter, Head of Division, Multilateral Organisation Performance Assessment Network (MOPAN), OECD, will update members on the MOPAN work and an evaluation of MOPAN currently under way.

14. Members will be invited to discuss these efforts on multilateral effectiveness and how to take this work forward, while also sharing how this topic is being addressed in their own agencies/Ministries.

V. Supporting Evaluation Capacity Development (16:30-17:30)

15. During this session members will discuss current work on strengthening evaluation capacities, focusing on support to partner country systems. Riitta Oksanen (Finland) will give an update on the network's Evaluation Capacity Development (ECD) task team including work on developing a tool-kit for advocating for evaluation. There will also be a short update on the Clear Initiative Regional Centers for Learning on Evaluation and Results, and Claude Leroy-Themeze (France) will present a concept note on supporting joint evaluations with country partners.

16. Members will be invited to reflect on the role of donor evaluation departments in strengthening co-ordination and supporting an enabling environment for learning and evaluation in partner countries.

VI. Any Other Business & Closing Session (17:30-18:00)

17. The floor will be open for any other business.

18. The Chair will close the meeting with a wrap-up of the discussion and highlights of follow-up action points.
