

## Implementing the Anti-Corruption Action Plan for Asia-Pacific: Reforms and anti-corruption resources Kazakhstan

The Republic of Kazakhstan joined the ADB/OECD Anti-Corruption Initiative for Asia-Pacific in May 2002 ([▶ endorsement statement](#)) and is represented in the Initiative's Steering Group through its Anti-Corruption Commission under the country's President.

### Anti-Corruption reform in the framework of the Action Plan

Kazakhstan's current priorities for reform under the Anti-Corruption Action Plan concern the [reduction of corruption in all spheres of society by means of enhancing coordination of state bodies and civil society actors' operations](#).

Kazakhstan's reform progress is documented in the regular reports that the country delivered at the Steering Group meetings ([▶ reform progress](#)). The region-wide report on [Anti-Corruption Policies in Asia-Pacific](#) provides a horizontal overview of Kazakhstan's policies, institutions and frameworks as well as progress in this area as of the first quarter of 2006. The outcome of the Initiative's Thematic Reviews provides more detailed analysis of mechanisms to [curb corruption in public procurement](#) and the instruments in place to seek and provide [mutual legal assistance, extradition and the recovery of proceeds of corruption](#).
