



## Implementing the Anti-Corruption Action Plan for Asia-Pacific: Reforms and anti-corruption resources Papua New Guinea

Papua New Guinea joined the ADB/OECD Anti-Corruption Initiative for Asia-Pacific in November 2001 ([▶ endorsement statement](#)) and is represented in the Initiative's Steering Group through the National Anti-Corruption Alliance (NACA).

### Anti-Corruption reform in the framework of the Action Plan

Papua New Guinea's current priorities for reform under the Anti-Corruption Action Plan concern a [National Corruption Survey](#), [Equipping the National Anti-corruption Alliance Offices](#), and the organization of a [Workshop on the United Nations Convention Against Corruption](#).

Papua New Guinea's reform progress is documented in the regular reports that the country delivered at the Steering Group meetings ([▶ reform progress](#)). The region-wide report on [Anti-Corruption Policies in Asia-Pacific](#) provides a horizontal overview of Papua New Guinea's policies, institutions and frameworks as well as progress in this area as of the first quarter of 2006. The outcome of the Initiative's Thematic Reviews provides more detailed analysis of mechanisms to [curb corruption in public procurement](#) and the instruments in place to seek and provide [mutual legal assistance, extradition and the recovery of proceeds of corruption](#).
