<p><b>Natural persons:</b>  In Lithuania the TIN equals the Lithuanian personal code.  This code is immutable throughout the life of the natural person.</p> <p><b>Non-natural persons / companies:</b>  In Lithuania the TIN equals the code the Lithuanian legal entity code.  All legal entities registered in the Register of Legal Entities are assigned a legal entity code. This code is immutable throughout the life cycle of the legal entity. The legal entity code must be printed in the legal entity's official documents.</p>

<b>Structure: TIN Format</b>	[C1, C2, C3, C4, C5, C6, C7, C8, C9, C10, C11]	Where C1 to C11 are characters.																																									
<b>Structure: Range</b>	C1, C2, C3, C4, C5, C6, C7, C8, C9, C10, C11	A numeric.																																									
<b>Structure: Rules</b>	C1	Can only take the value 1 to 6.

## Section II – TIN Structure (non-natural persons)

The legal entity code has a fixed length and consists of 9 digits.

The code is provided from an unused 8-digit code pool with the addition of a 9th check digit. The check digit is calculated according to module 11 by evaluating the weights of each of the first 8 digits.

The rule for forming the 9th check digit:

Each digit of the legal entity code, starting with the first one, is multiplied by the weights 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8. The sum of the products is calculated, which is divisible by 11.

The remainder of the division is the 9th check digit of the legal entity code. If the remainder is 10, then another 8-digit code is taken from the unused code set and the 9th check digit is calculated again.

### Passport

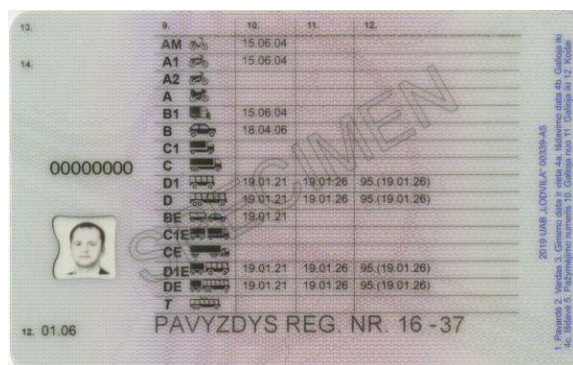
Most recent passport of Republic of Lithuania shown below:
