Universities and entrepreneurship ...


- 1. Universities can function as:
 - Knowledge generators
 - Meeting places for creative people with different risk perceptions
 - Interdisciplinary spaces for new business ideas, business concepts, innovative problem solving
 - Points of R&D access for firms
- 2. Universities can be an important component in the entrepreneurship and SME policy delivery framework, in particular with regard to:
 - Enhancing new entrepreneurship
 - Fostering innovation and growth in the existing local firm base





OECD LEED policy development work

- Review of local entrepreneurship and innovation support systems: focus on universities
 - Analysis of strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats
 - Capacity building: international peer review, tailored recommendations and learning from good practice
- "6 Dimensions" Assessment Framework:





What can public policy do?

- Encourage universities in "third mission"
 - Kick-off investment for entrepreneurship support infrastructure
 - Reward entrepreneurial universities
 - etc.
- Facilitate university-firm relationships
 - Innovation support for firms
 - Incubation and technology park facilities (co-location)
 - etc.
- Allow for international exchange and peer reviews
 - Work with OECD LEED





