



CELEBRATING 30 YEARS OF CAPACITY BUILDING



Since its founding in 1992, the Global Relations Programme (GRP) has served and advanced its mission to equip tax officials from developing countries with the knowledge and skills to address the most pressing challenges in international taxation.

Through the last three decades, the GRP has expanded by developing fruitful collaborations with other organisations, and establishing Multilateral Tax Centres (MTCs) in Austria, China, Hungary, Korea, Mexico, and Türkiye.

During the last few years, and accelerated by the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, GRP's digital learning ecosystem has incorporated more live virtual workshops, Q&A sessions and recorded webinars to its learning repertoire. With these new formats alone, GRP trained over 6000 participants from more than 180 countries in 2021.

Since its modest beginnings in the early 1990s, when the GRP offered limited training events to a few non-OECD member countries, the GRP now provides a truly global training hub offering an increasingly digitalised learning system, encompassing live and self-paced capacity-building activities and tools on a broad range of international tax topics.

This meeting provided a forum to discuss avenues to strengthen the development, delivery and monitoring of bilateral and multilateral tax programmes offered by the OECD.
