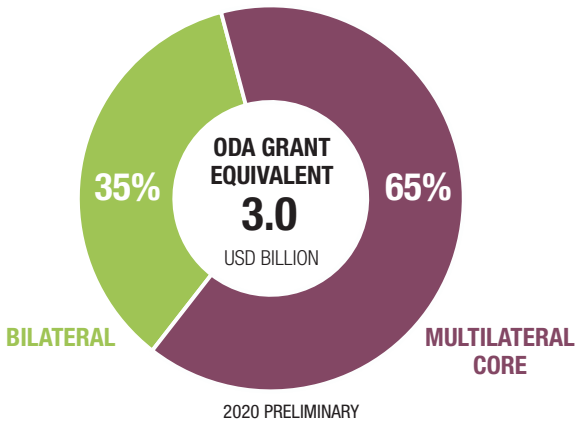

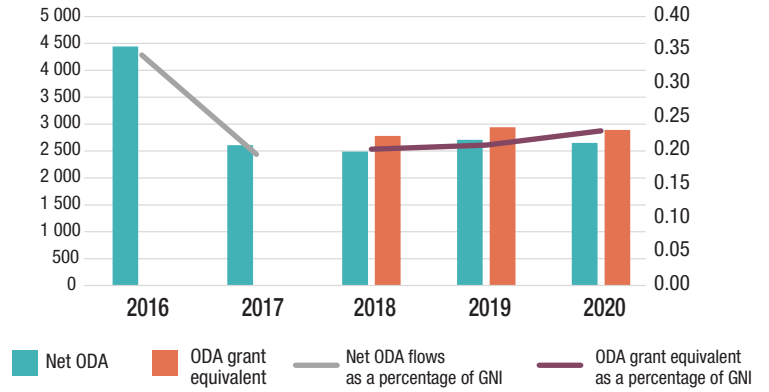

SPAIN HAS PROVIDED USD 3 BILLION AS ODA



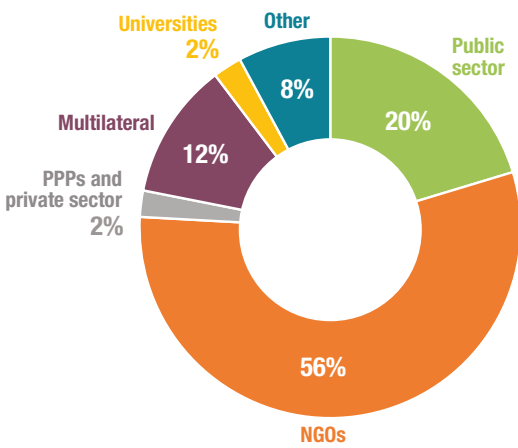
ODA CONTRIBUTIONS HAVE STABILISED

ODA volume in USD 2019 constant prices



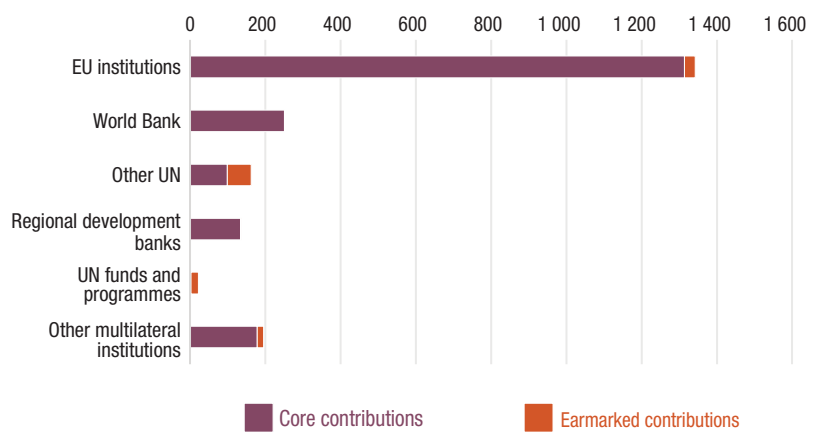
NGOs ARE A KEY PARTNER FOR DELIVERY

% gross disbursements



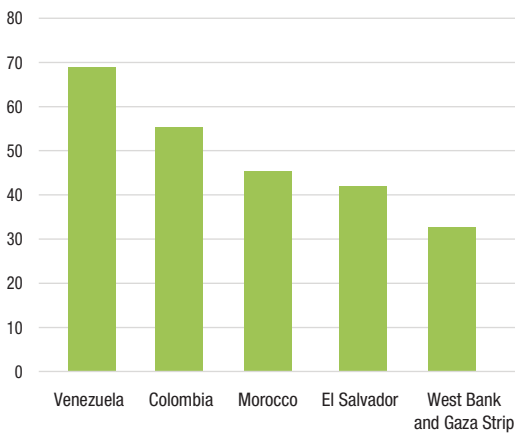
THE EU IS SPAIN'S FIRST MULTILATERAL PARTNER
