

***Interacting with the public procurement system in Russia: good practices and guidance to fight bid-rigging***

Procurement is a high-risk area for companies and public entities alike, notably due to the sums of money involved as well as the interaction required with third or counterparties for the execution of related transactions.

This seminar will allow company representatives to explore particular risks and opportunities presented through engagement in procurement and contracting with the state. The seminar will firstly look at international guidance on integrity in public procurement and establishing a level playing field through competition law. Secondly, the seminar will allow participants to delve deeper into innovative practices, including those that Russian companies use, to minimize corruption risk in the process.

Each session is supported and tailored by research and other material relevant to the topic area, and conducted by specialist speakers from Deloitte and FAS, amongst others, as well as with the sharing of concrete experience by local businesses.
