Summary

This forum is a dedicated G20 Investment and Infrastructure Working Group (IIWG) event and part of the Second IIWG meeting. Following the instruction given by G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors in their Shanghai meeting of February, IIWG will focus on an infrastructure agenda with 3 priorities in 2016:

- 1) encouraging Multilateral Development Banks to advance infrastructure investment by taking joint actions;
- 2) promoting global infrastructure connectivity; and
- 3) exploring diversified financing approaches and fostering private financing.

This event is hosted by the Government of Singapore and organized by the World Bank, the OECD and IE Singapore with strong support from the Chinese Presidency and Indonesian Co-Chair. It will take place on April 27, 2016 (from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm) and gather members of the IIWG, of key government agencies, of selected private operators and investors, and of international organizations.

It aims to:

- i. Deepen the understanding of infrastructure connectivity needs and identify major impediments to connectivity
- ii. Explore, through case studies, efficient and effective approaches to improve infrastructure connectivity
- iii. Raise awareness and discuss solutions for improving connectivity and strengthening synergies among existing infrastructure connectivity initiatives
- iv. Provide an opportunity to share thoughts on principles for creating a Global Infrastructure Connectivity Alliance
