OECD EPR PROGRAMME AND SD A solid influential experience

- All OECD Countries reviewed
 (1st Cycle and 2nd Cycle completed)
- Non-OECD Countries
 (e.g. Bulgaria, Russia, Chile, China)
- 62 OECD EPRs completed
- Key concepts: performance, peer review, accountability, recommendations, influence

OECD EPR PROGRAMME AND SD A long-term twinned path

- SD has always played a significant role in the frame of EPRs
- Present in the 1st Cycle of the Reviews in the 1990's
- Central issue within all the 2nd Cycle developed since 2000

OECD EPR PROGRAMME AND SD SD experts in EPRs reviewing teams

- Sustainable development experts in the OECD EPRs teams. e.g.:
- Johanne Gelinas (Federal Commissioner for Environment & SD in the Canadian Office of the Auditor General)
- Nadine Gouzée (Coordinator of the Belgian Task Force on SD – UN-CSD)

OECD EPR PROGRAMME AND SD Links with SD Peer Reviews attempts

- Reflection on sustainable development in PRs
- Exchanges with:
 - AMSDE (Stockholm Conference, Aug.2006)
 - UN-CSD & UN-DESA
 - European Commission (test SD PRs)
 - World Bank (CEAs and SEAs)
- Often absence of sufficient financial & human resources
 - → no systematic SD Peer Reviewsoecd ((5) ocde

SD IN THE EPR REPORT SD institutional setting

- <u>national strategy</u> for Sustainable Development (content, indicators, ambition, monitoring)
- institutional and governance setting (e.g. Committee, Council; Law; Administrative support, State structure)
- local level, of parallel reinforcing initiatives, like Local Agenda 21, urban and regional plans for sustainable development

SD IN THE EPR REPORT: SD in practice: institutional integration

- national and sectoral <u>strategies</u>
- plans
- programmes
- budget
- project design, selection and approval



SD IN THE EPR REPORT: SD in practice: market-based integration

- <u>price</u> signal, polluter-pays-principle
- economic instruments (taxes and charges)
- environmentally-damaging and marketdistorting <u>subsidies</u> (incentives, exemptions, tax deductions)



SD IN THE EPR REPORT: Sectoral Integration

- Permanent:
 - transport and environment
 - energy and environment
 - agriculture and environment
- Occasional:
 - building, forestry, mining, fisheries, ...



SD IN THE EPR REPORT The social-environmental chapter

In the 2nd Cycle, a specific social-environmental chapter in all Country Reviews. Issues such as:

- green jobs (environment & employment)
- the role of green <u>technologies</u>, research and innovation
- <u>health</u> environmental impacts
- social <u>poverty</u> issues and environmental policies
- social, gender & <u>ethnic</u> minorities & environmental policies
- environmental <u>democracy</u>
- environmental <u>education</u> and awareness



CONCLUSIONS OECD EPRs as an instrument serving SD

- ☐ EPRs: a solid stronghold for SD, in the OECD tradition of Peer Reviews
- □ SD can be improved in the Report, but we can build upon a solid base and roots
- EPRs: a service to the community of SD experts & governments' community
