As provided for in paragraph 4 f) of the Annex to the Revised Resolution of the Council on Partnerships in OECD bodies [[C\(2012\)100/REV1/FINAL](#)], according to which a Partner may terminate the Participant status with a twelve months' notice, the termination of the Philippines' status as a Participant in the Tourism Committee and its subsidiary bodies will take effect on 6 October 2021. In the meantime, the Philippines will remain a Participant.

<sup>3</sup> In 2016, the Council invited South Africa to become an Associate in the Tourism Committee and its subsidiary bodies. However, by a letter dated 1 April 2019, South Africa expressed a preference for remaining a Participant.
