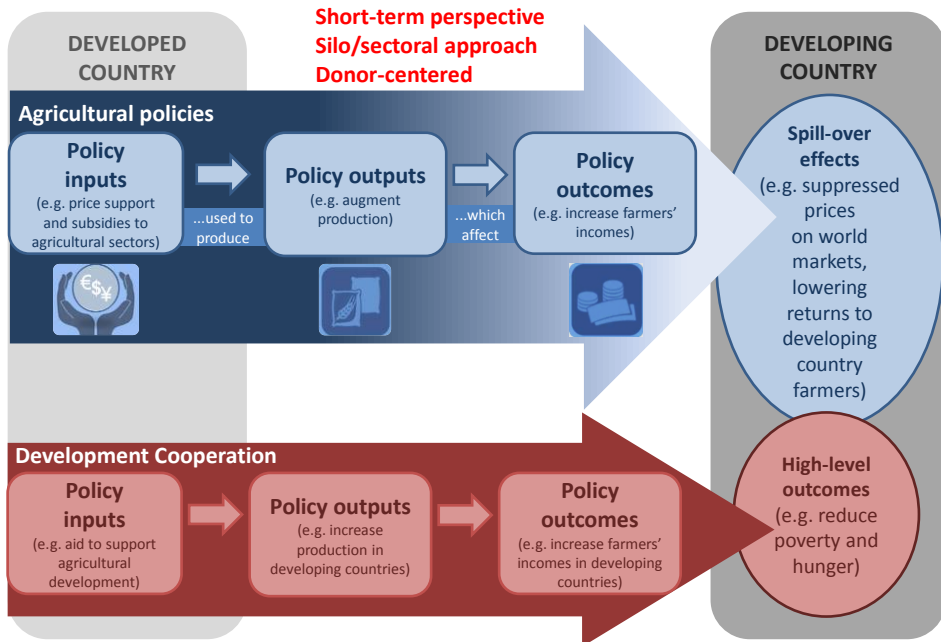

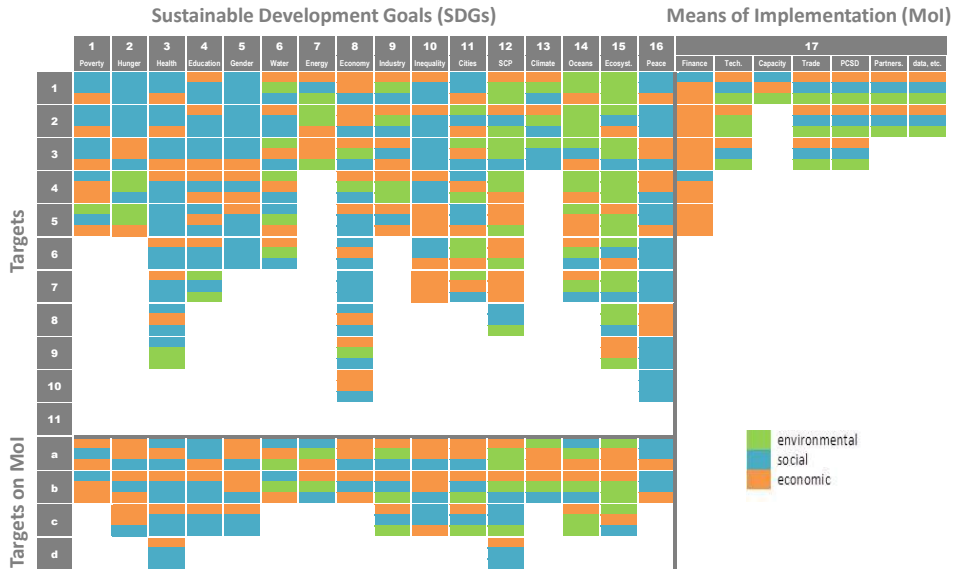

The limitations of the “do no harm” approach to PCD

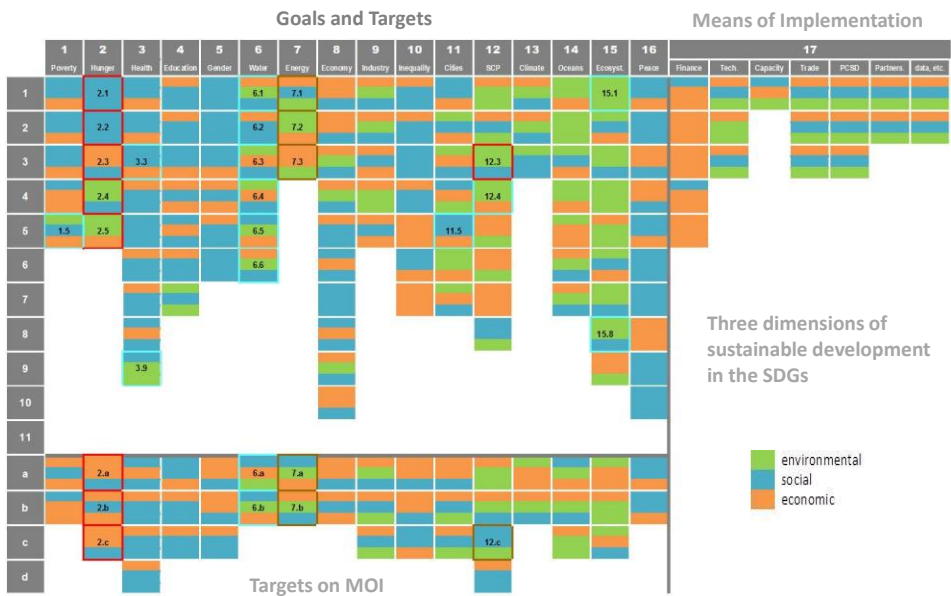


Three dimensions of Sustainable Development in the SDGs



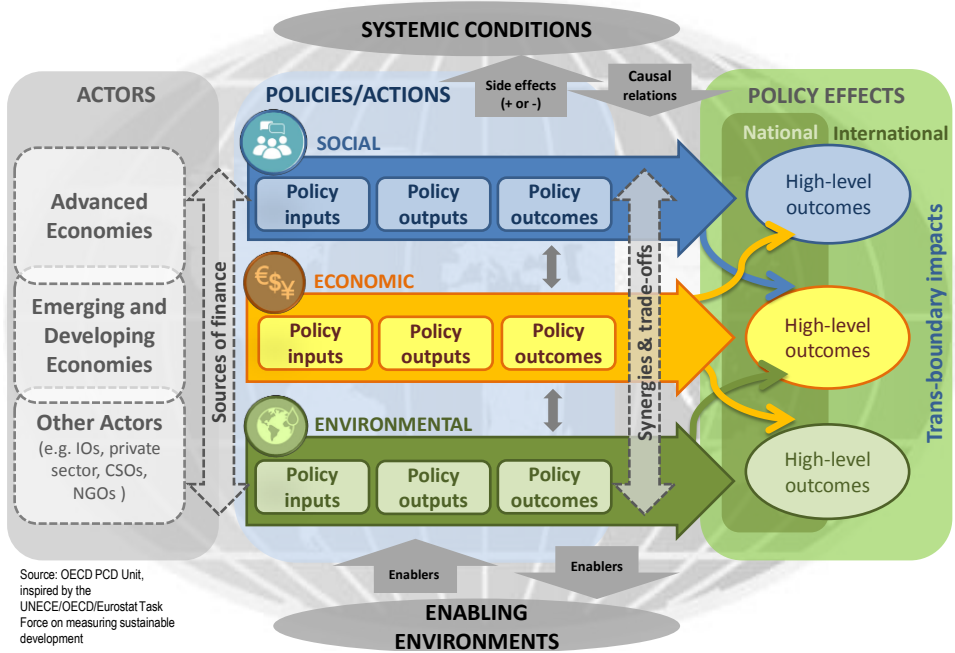

A new framework for PCSD



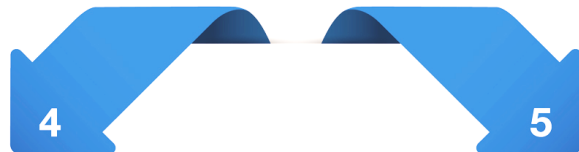
PCSD – An integral part of the MoI for the post-2015 Agenda

Coherence among international agendas and processes
 MDGs; Rio+20 SDGs; Climate Change Agenda, G20

Coherence between economic; social and environmental policies
 For more integrated approaches to sustainability



Coherence between global goals and national contexts
 Universal Agenda



Coherence between different sources of finance
 Public, private, international and domestic

Coherence between diverse actions of multiple actors and stakeholders
 Governments, international and regional organisations, CSOs; private sector

Moving from PCD towards PCSD in member countries

What can you do to implement the new agenda?

1. Build a common understanding through multi-stakeholder engagement
2. Foster bottom-up *and* top-down processes (complementary) to set priorities and country-specific SDG targets
3. Identify inter-linkages and potential trade-offs between various goals and targets
4. Promote integrated approaches, taking account also of non-policy drivers and trans-boundary impacts
5. Develop and mainstream sustainable development criteria in national policy-making

Moving from PCD towards PCSD at the OECD

How can the OECD support your efforts?

1. Elaborate a conceptual framework for PCSD
2. Identify and map existing OECD indicators, policy instruments, and dialogue platforms, relevant for the SDGs
3. Facilitate exchange of good practices among countries
4. Update and improve existing PCD instruments, develop new tools (e.g. online monitoring matrix)
5. Strengthen the evidence-base for PCSD (e.g. CODE Reports)
