



Invited speakers will highlight governance practices from across the disaster risk management cycle, including: mechanisms to ensure policy coherence, tools for setting priorities informed by risk analysis and community consultation processes.

Particular focus will be given to peer reviews as a governance tool covering experiences in countries from Latin America, Africa and the EU.
