CONTEXT

Less than 5 in 10 young people trust their government across OECD countries in 2021 and young people continue to lack voice and representation in public life. Already before the COVID-19 crisis, young people across 16 OECD countries were more likely than older people to hold a disenchanted view about democracy. The long-term effects of the COVID-19 crisis may widen generational inequalities and have lasting impacts on youth's trust in government and their association with democratic processes, as demonstrated in the OECD Policy Paper (2020) "[COVID-19 and Youth: Response, Recovery and Resilience](#)" and OECD Report (2020) "[Fit for all Generations?](#)". At the same time, young people have led social movements to demand greater ambition in tackling climate change and played an important role in building societal resilience during the pandemic.

The event will bring together a high-level panel of policymakers and representatives from youth associations to discuss how governments can strengthen the participation and representation of young people in democratic processes in times of crisis, notably in the recovery from the COVID-19 crisis. The webinar will present preliminary results from the [2nd edition of the OECD Youth and COVID-19 survey](#) on the concerns of youth-led organisations over the long-term effects of the crisis and their priorities for the recovery. It will also present new OECD analysis on the integration of youth and intergenerational commitments in countries' recovery measures.

The webinar is organised by the OECD Public Governance Directorate in the context of the OECD Youth Week 2021.
