

## SMEs are less innovative than large firms, but they receive more government support

## Government Support to Innovation in SMEs

Government use various instruments to support innovation in SMEs:

- R&D tax credit
- Subsidies
- Provision of funds (capital, loans)
- Demand side policies: Public procurement
- ➤ Need to optimise the policy mix.
- Advantage of public procurement for recipients: provides not only funding, but experience and sort of quality certification.

## Public Procurement might Favour Larger Firms

A number of features might lead public procurement to favour large firms if no corrective measure is taken:

- Complexity of bidding (<u>cost</u> issue)
- Often needs large quantities (<u>capacity</u> issue)
- Payment might come late (<u>liquidity</u> issue)
- SMEs have a higher risk to fail to innovate, which might deter panels to select them (<u>risk</u> issue)



#### **Special Provisions for SMEs**

A majority of OECD countries have special provisions for SMEs in their public procurement:

- ⇒ Quotas or targets of small firms among recipients
- ⇒ Procurement in smaller packages
- ⇒ Improving information (platforms)
- ⇒ Simplifying procedures



#### **SBIR**

A number of countries have a version of SBIR – Small Business Innovation Research Program (US, UK, Japan Netherlands, Australia etc.) = provides early stage financial support to high-risk innovative small firms. Major features are:

- The recipient retains the IP
- Staged financing (similar to venture capital)
- Highly selective
- Usually handled at the specialised agency level



#### **Evaluation: We Need the Data!**

- A few evaluations have drawn mixed conclusions: little additionality but some encouragement to entrepreneurship and VC raising
- Evaluation of programs is rare because data is not available:

=> At the age of Big Data government should make the information accessible!
