Workshop “E-Government Tools in Practice: How to Develop a Sound Implementation Road Map”

This workshop is organized within the MENA-OECD Initiative to Support the Palestinian National Plan. The purpose of this workshop is to provide participants with a practical overview on the most important elements to be included in a sound e-government implementation road map. Issues of leadership, internal coordination, horizontal and vertical integration, quality evaluation and projects prioritisation will be dealt with through presentations from senior experts and then illustrated by real examples from MENA and OECD countries. A session of questions and answers will follow each slot to make sure that information provided are discussed in light of the current situation of the PNA.

In particular, the various sessions will include discussions on how OECD countries have designed and managed the implementation of e-government services by specifically looking at the case of Italy. Additionally, discussions will focus on how to use a quality driven methodology to select and implement e-government projects, drawing from the experience of University of Milan-Bicocca and of the project “*eGovernment for Mediterranean Countries*”. The Danish experience will then be key in showcasing the mechanisms of the OECD peer advice system and how it can support national policy making. Finally, participants will benefit from an overview of some of the major international actors in the field of e-government in the PNA with the aim of identifying and assessing potential areas of collaboration.

At the end of the workshop, there will be a joint-session with the Regulatory team to discuss the use of ICT tools to facilitate public consultation and the creation of One-Stop Shops. The workshop is highly interactive and participants are encouraged to share experiences as much as possible.

On the last day, individual advisory sessions will be held to further investigate PNA needs and priorities and to better define how the OECD can address them through the MENA-OECD Initiative to Support the Palestinian National Plan
