# Agenda

## Background

In 2018-2019, the OECD and the European Commission (EC) initiated a partnership to support data collection and the elaboration of new indicators to better assess decentralisation and subnational public finance in 24 OECD and EU countries. The work resulted in the creation of the Regional Government Finance and Investment Database (REGOFI) and two datasets on municipal fiscal data.

In 2021–2024, the OECD and the EC continue partnering to expand the data collection to the individual regional and local government levels on subnational finance and investment and **develop, for the first time, a pilot database on subnational public employment (SNPE) with a gender perspective**. This pilot database will serve as a basis to assess the level of human capacity in regions and municipalities across OECD and EU countries. In relation with the databases on regional and municipal fiscal data, the SNPE may also enable to overview the linkages between the share and characteristics of subnational public employment, and the level of fiscal decentralisation of subnational governments in OECD and EU countries. This database may also potentially serve as a tool to support policymaking in EU and OECD countries by allowing a comprehensive picture of the needs and gaps on human capacities of territorial entities.

## Objectives of the Workshop

This first workshop will gather the OECD, the EC, representatives of national statistical institute or statistical offices, representatives of subnational governments, and experts to discuss the methodology, challenges and ways forward for building the new SNPE.

This workshop will give participants the opportunity to discuss:

- The methodology developed to collect the data for the SNPE;
- Challenges and opportunities in subnational employment data availability
- Research and policy design using cross-country subnational public employment databases;

The workshop also aims at reinforcing the commitment of statistical institutes, offices or any relevant institution responsible for gathering this type of data, towards providing reliable and updated data on subnational public employment.
